This week Dean Felker hosted Jason Wells, our guest speaker. Jason is the Director of Business Operations for Hancock Health (HH) and serves as the coordinator for the Mayo CHINC NERVOIX Relationship with Hancock Health (MCNR). Jason is also a registered nurse with degrees in Health from University of Indianapolis and Indiana University. Hancock Health became the 48th hospital to become a member of the world-wide MCNR. In the past MCNR did not accept HH into their network. After recent upgrades at HH, A 995-page report on HH's operations and an on-site visit by Mayo personnel, over several days, HH became a network facility on June 29, 2022. Jason shared with the club all the benefits of being a network member, which comes with a cost to HH. HH staff, now, have access to Mayo Clinic's "Mayo Up to Date app", which provides a whole suite of tools and resources covering "how to's" to recent medical developments, which help staff their training, as well as helping them diagnose their patient's illnesses.

The network provides video education as well as information from the latest clinical trials. Their E-consult Program' allows HH staff submit medical records and test results on patients exhibiting hard to diagnose illness. Forty-three local patients have already been submitted for evaluation from Mayo experts. Hancock Health has also taken advantage of the Inpatient Telephone Consult Program included in the network. Three local patients have benefited from an immediate consult from

The Mayo experts. An ancillary benefit to being a part of this network is that HH can also tap into the resources of the 47 other MCNR facilities and their staff. This includes assistance with health care consulting and administrative issues. Next Week's Meeting:

Rotary International's motto is SERVICE ABOVE SELF. Fostering our commitment to service is the foundation of every club. The five Avenues of Service for Rotary and its Club Members are:

Service to our Community...Service to our Club...Service to Youth...International Service...and Vocational Service...

In the Vocational Service area, our club has searched for members of our community, who are not Rotarians, to honor with the Vocational Service Award. Chairing the committee focused on this search for many years was a man himself dedicated to service...Dr. John A. Long. John was an Optometrist by profession and a Rotarian by choice. He was a member of this Club from 1955 until the time of his death in 2014. We honored John after his passing by renaming this Award in his memory. Today we will recognize our 2022 award recipient.

THE PURPOSE OF THIS AWARD---is to honor an individual for meritorious conduct or service in her or his professional and/or vocational activities. This service can be to individuals, to the community at large, and/or to other organizations.

ELIGIBILITY FOR THE AWARD---requires a connection to Hancock County through residence, business, and/or area of service. Rotarians and their immediate families are not eligible.

NOMINATIONS---come from Rotarians submitting a narrative description of the meritorious service of the individual.

JUDGING---of the nominees was done by committee members.
