Rotary International's motto is SERVICE ABOVE SELF. Fostering our commitment to service is the foundation of every club. The five Avenues of Service for Rotary and its Club Members are:

Service to our Community...Service to our Club...Service to Youth...International Service...and Vocational Service...

In the Vocational Service area, our club has searched for members of our community, who are not Rotarians, to honor with the Vocational Service Award. Chairing the committee focused on this search for many years was a man himself dedicated to service...Dr. John A. Long. John was an Optometrist by profession and a Rotarian by choice. He was a member of this Club from 1955 until the time of his death in 2014. We honored John after his passing by renaming this Award in his memory. Today we will recognize our 2022 award recipient.

THE PURPOSE OF THIS AWARD---is to honor an individual for meritorious conduct or service in her or his professional and/or vocational activities. This service can be to individuals, to the community at large, and/or to other organizations.

ELIGIBILITY FOR THE AWARD---requires a connection to Hancock County through residence, business, and/or area of service. Rotarians and their immediate families are not eligible.

NOMINATIONS---come from Rotarians submitting a narrative description of the meritorious service of the individual.

JUDGING---of the nominees was done by committee members.

The Rotary Club of Greenfield would like to thank Betsy and Sherry Haines and Miler's Jewelry for providing the plaque for our recipient.

It is with great pleasure that this year's Rotary Club of Greenfield John Long Memorial Vocational Service Award recipient is COSTA STYLIANOU.

Since arriving in Greenfield, Costa Stylianou has had a tremendous impact on individuals and the community at large. Costa is the owner of Costa's Grill and the Lincoln Square restaurants in Greenfield and Fortville. He is very generous with his time, talents and treasure. 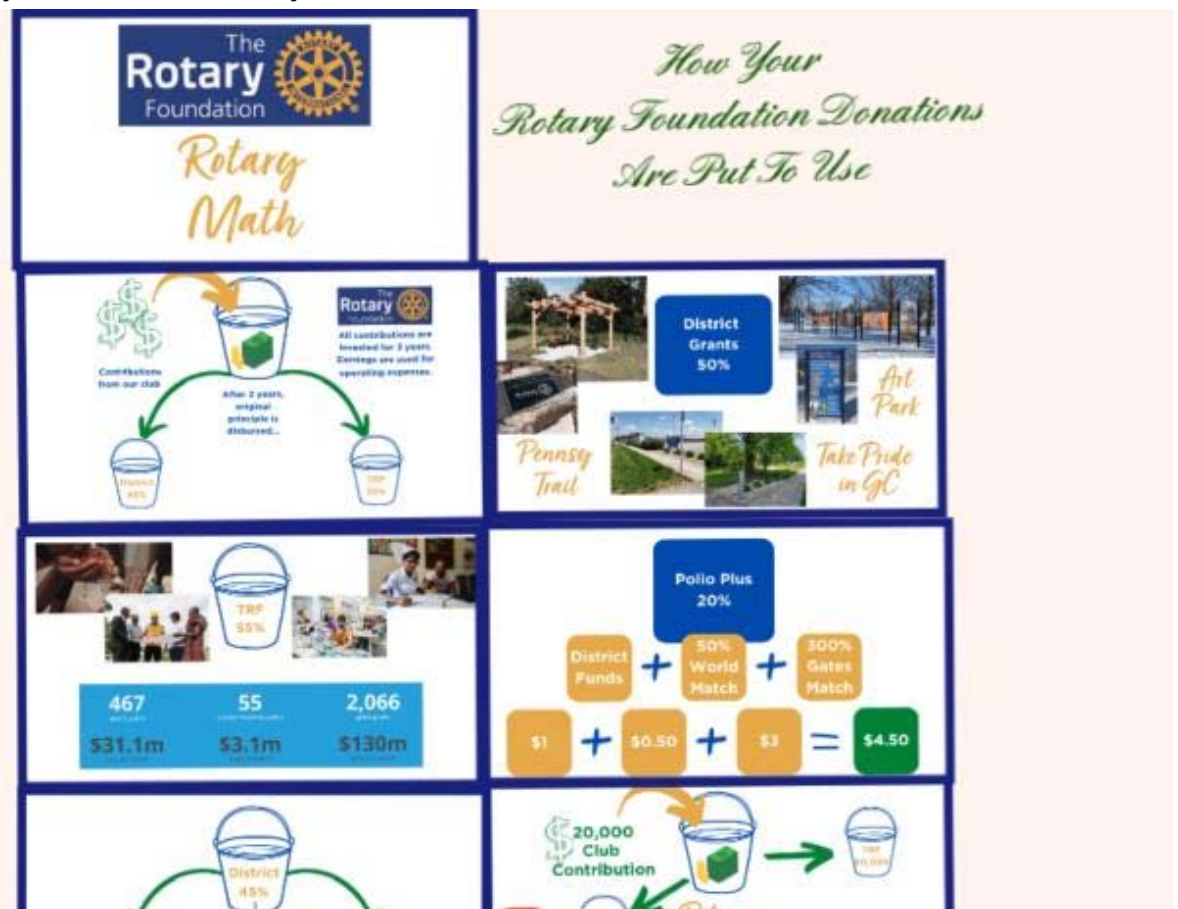

Both Rotary International (RI) and Rotary District 6560 have also help fund Gift of Life Medical Missions. It is the intent of the Foundation to hold donated funds for 3 years and using the investment earnings to cover their operating expenses; in turn they plan to then allocate 100% of the principal donated to provide international, regional and local grants. During recent recessions and market downturns, some of the principal to help cover a small portion of the Foundation's operating expenses. Last year 91% of Foundation principal was paid out in grants. As a result, we continue to be rated 4 Star by Charity Navigator;(their highest ranking)

Historically, the Foundation has been in operation for more than 100 years. \$4 billion in sustainable grants have been paid out in that timeframe. Grants are made to support the following "areas of focus" of Rotary International and districts and clubs around the world:

- Basic education & literacy
- Community economic development
- Disease prevention & treatment
- Maternal & child health
- Peace building & conflict resolution
- Water, Sanitation & hygiene

RI suggest that each Rotarian make a contribution of any amount (not less than \$25, whereas our club asks that you give at least \$26.50) The hope of RI is that we achieve "Every Rotarian, Every Year". Our club has achieved that goal in the past and with our current membership, I believe we can do it again in 2022.

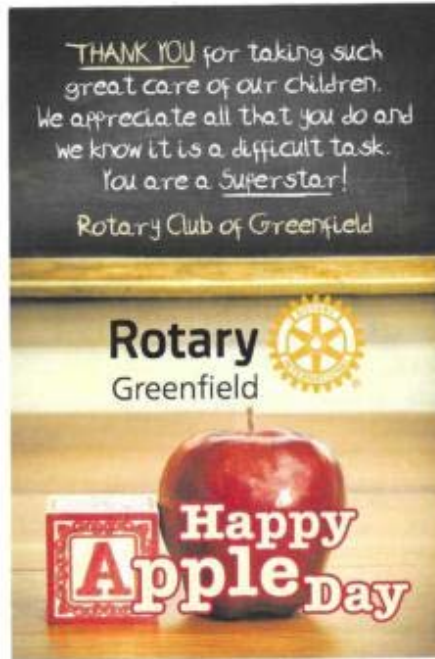
