# PROGRAM:

Chief Scott Galloway of the Lafayette Police



Department (LPD) was appointed by Mayor Roswarski in 2022 and has been with the department for twenty-seven years. There are 140 sworn personnel in the department and 58 civilian personnel. Chief Galloway believes that

the leader of an organization sets the tone and his goal is to exemplify integrity, humility, and a positive mental attitude. Police have powers such as the ability to arrest someone, that civilians do not have. It is important to him that members of the force do not become complacent about these special privileges by cutting corners or becoming lazy in carrying out their duties. Galloway is also concerned about the perception citizens have about the LPD. He provided statistics to show that the number of crimes in Lafayette have gone down significantly at the same time that the population has risen. The LPD meets regularly with the West Lafayette police, the county sheriff's department, and the Purdue police to share information and coordinate on difficult investigations. The city council and the department of public works also work together with the police department. The new Public Safety building downtown is state-of-theart and enables the police to perform their duties with modern technology.
