PROGRAM:

Voestalpine, a public company, has its origins in steel production in the country of Austria. It has grown to a large organization in fifty countries with over 52,000 employees. Anthony Pille spoke to us about their local manufacturing facility located on route 52 south of Lafayette. At this facility they produce millions of automobile parts each year including seatbelt



fasteners, side airbag inflator tubes, pistons and housings among others. Between 125 and 150 employees work at the plant, which was opened in the year 2000. They supply parts for Ford F150 trucks, as well as Tesla and Mercedes cars. Some of the factors that went into the

decision to open a manufacturing facility in Lafayette included proximity to Purdue and to Chicago and also support from the community. The tariffs that have been applied in the last two years to goods coming into the United States have disrupted the supply chain and have created uncertainty resulting in loss of business for U.S. companies. Voestalpine is seeking to make the necessary changes to solve this problem as it relates to their factories here in the U.S.
