PROGRAM:

Five different Rotarians shared about a variety of organizations that they support and participate in. RYAN MCLAUGHLIN talked about Lafayette Symphony Orchestra, which was founded in 1950. This is a group of professional musicians that enhances the cultural aspect of our community and provides educational opportunities. More than 5,000 school students are impacted by their programs each year. Two unique concerts are coming up: Love Songs on April 6th and Rock Stars on May 18th. The rock stars referred to are Pyotr Tchaikovsky and Freddie Mercury of the band Queen. Sounds interesting! KATIE NIELSEN informed us about the

Community Cancer Network which was started twelve years ago by five physicians who saw the needs of their patients. The CCN helps to supply needed medical equipment, transportation, wigs, and financial help to those who are struggling with the disease. Currently they have 230 active clients and only two full time and one part time staff. On April 5th they are holding a prom with a Wizard of Oz theme and Faye Cole playing the part of Dorothy. Their goal is to spread Love, Hope and Care. Katie also talked about the Round the Fountain art fair held annually during Memorial Day weekend. It was started by her father, Bud Baugh, a former Rotarian. MARIANNE ROSE talked about two related philanthropic organizations, 100+ Women Who Care and Men Who Give. To participate in one of these, a member must commit to giving \$500 in a calendar year. One hundred dollars goes towards an endowment and each of the other gifts of \$100 are given to organizations presented and voted on at the quarterly meetings. Find more information on the website of The Community Foundation of Greater Lafayette. SAM BIEDERSTEDT has volunteered with Tree Lafayette since 2004, but the organization is twenty-five years old. Both young and old are members of this group which planted its 3000th tree in front of City Hall last year. They will be celebrating Earth Day on April 22nd with a tree planting and also Arbor Day on April 26th when sixty trees will be installed at the new softball complex on the south side of Lafayette. GENE HILLS spoke about the Elks Club, a Charitable and Patriotic organization. One of their programs is called Red Stocking, for which they raised over \$6,000 last year. They hold weekly bingo nights at the West Lafayette Golf and Country Club as well as an annual golf outing and a monthly Texas Hold'em games. Last year the Elks provided benches at Rotary Memorial Plaza in Columbian Park.
