Consultant with Purdue's Manufacturing Extension Partnership. He gave some timely advice about keeping our computers free from malware and our online activity free from hackers. He suggested that we pay attention to the people we work with and around. Although

we may know someone over a period of time, that is not a guarantee of their good intentions. He warned about email attachments and links that should only be clicked on if we are sure of the source. We should use separate personal and business computers, devices and accounts. Do not connect untrusted storage

devices such as thumb drives into your computer. When downloading software, check that you are on the official site of the providing company. And of course, do not give out personal information. When determining a password, he suggested stringing together three unrelated words to form a nonsensical phrase such as "chairstaplerclock." Too often people use passwords such as "12345" or "qwerty" or even "password." His parting advice was "don't be the slowest rabbit" meaning the one who does nothing to put protections in place. That is who the hackers will go after first.
