PROGRAM:

Mike Brzezinski has been with Purdue since 1993 and
 is the Dean of International
 Programs. This includes the
 International Students and Scholars
 department as well as Study Abroad
 programs and the Center for
 Intercultural Learning, Mentorship,
 Assessment and Resource
 (CILMAR). Purdue actively recruits



students from around the world and receives more
 than 11,000 applications per year from foreign

students. The target is to have 10% of the freshman
 class be international students. This equates to about
 800 new students per year. Among the international
 student population, approximately 30% are from China,
 20% from India, 10% from South Korea and the
 remaining 40% from other countries. This office works
 to help the students maintain their legal status. One
 important outreach is the International Friendship
 Program which pairs foreign students with local
 community members, enabling the students to learn
 first-hand about American home life. There are many
 internationals among the faculty as well. About 1,000
 new scholars come to campus each year from around
 the world. In all, almost 40% of Purdue faculty are
 foreign born. More and more students are taking
 advantage of study abroad opportunities, one of
 President Daniels' Big Moves. By the time of
 graduation, about 30% of students have had an
 international experience. The CILMAR was created in
 2016 with the goal of helping students gain the
 knowledge, skill and attitudinal development to be able
 to bridge cultural differences.
