PROGRAM:

Me-Me Pruitt and Holly Merchant spoke to us today about the Alzheimer's Association and the upcoming Alzheimer's Walk. The organization has seventy-five chapters nationwide and their vision is to have a world without Alzheimer's disease or dementia.



Dementia is the generic term for a variety of diseases that impact brain function. About 70% to 80% of people with dementia have Alzheimer's. It is one of the most feared diseases and affects six million Americans. Some ways of identifying Alzheimer's are that the person is not able to manage a budget or to keep track of the season or day of the week. Patients often misplace items and have difficulty with normal conversation. Some of the free services offered by the Alzheimer's Association include a 24/7 help line, support groups, and education programs. A support group meets at our location, the Northend Center, on the first and third Tuesdays of each month from 10 until noon. Money raised by the organization goes to support research to find a cure or means of helping with symptoms. Currently there are more than 750 research projects taking place in thirty-nine countries. The Walk to End Alzheimer's will be September 17th at Riehle Plaza in Lafayette. GAIL BRICKLER has formed a Rotary team and is also seeking volunteers for the event. Let her know of your interest.
