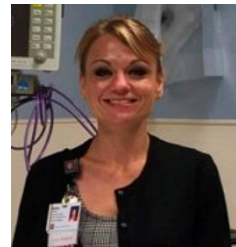

PROGRAM:

The IU Health Arnett Center of Hope provides care for victims of sexual assault, domestic violence, or child abuse in Tippecanoe and surrounding counties.

Megan Shupe is a forensic nurse who is trained to provide care specifically for those traumatized by such violence. Forensic nurses receive an additional 200 hours of training to be able to effectively help victims



who have been assaulted. Megan and the other fourteen nurses at Center of Hope provide free medical exams with photos and documentation that might be used in court cases. The Center opened in November of 2018 and they have treated fifty-one patients this year. The IU Foundation has provided money to purchase specialized equipment such as a camera capable of showing details of injuries received. The Victims of Crimes Act (VOCA) of 1984 provides funding for services such as this but it is possible that the amount of federal funds will be cut dramatically in the upcoming year. If someone reports sexual assault or physical violence, they are likely telling the truth. False reporting occurs 8% of the time, just as it does with other crimes. It is important that our society not sweep this problem under a rug. We all need to be aware that it is happening even in our own neighborhoods and families.
