#### Program Update - Dec 15, 2021 Jan Baer, Sergeant at Arms Rotary Club of Plainfield



Last week, fellow Rotarian Jan Baer shared some interesting and valuable information with her members regarding women in Rotary. In 1978, the Rotary Club of Duarte, California invited three women to become members. The RI Board withdrew the charter of that club for violation of the Rotary constitution. The club brought suit against Rotary International claiming a violation of a state civil rights law that prevents

discrimination of any form in business establishments or public accommodations. This went all the way to the United States Supreme Court and the court ruled that Rotary clubs do have a "business purpose" and are in some ways public-type organizations.

This allowed women to become Rotarians in any jurisdiction having similar "public accommodation" statutes. The RI constitution was changed in 1989, with a vote to eliminate the "male only" provision for all of Rotary. Since that time, women have become members and leaders of clubs and districts through the world.

Throughout the course of nearly seven decades of Rotary's history the idea of women members has been debated. The first constitution of the Chicago Rotary Club #1, adopted in January 1906, makes no reference to gender, referring only to "persons".

Interesting, in 1911 an all-women club existed in Minneapolis and between 1911 and 1917 an all-women Rotary club existed in Duluth, Minnesota alongside the men's club. The Rotary Convention in Duluth in 1912 discussed the admission of women and rejected the idea. The 1921 Rotary Convention in Edinburgh, Scotland produced the Standard Club Constitution in which Article 2, Section III stated "A Rotary Club shall be comprised of men..."

Since the 1989 Rotary Convention when membership was opened to women, the Rotary Club of Plainfield has had many active women members. In 1993 -94 Marjorie Albohn was the first female president of our club and was followed the next year in 1994-95 by Melaney Lybarger. In 2010-11 Julia Perkins was president; in 2013-14 Michele Marsh was president; in 2015-16 Diane Burks was president; and in 2020-21 Selina Lewis was president. All good leaders! We currently have 6 female Active Members out of a total 21 Active Members. Thank you Jan for sharing this interesting history about Rotary International and about our own club!
