Local Restaurateur & Entrepreneur Speaks to Greensburg Rotary About New Soy-based Snack Food Venture




(By Nathan Vandrey & Jeff Emsweller) During the October 7th Greensburg Rotary meeting, Mayasari "Maya" Effindi, owner of the local Mayasari Indonesian Grill, spoke to Rotarians about her newest venture into the food market, Maya Tempeh chips - sold as "SoyaMaya."

Tempeh is a traditional Indonesian fermented soybean product that has gained popularity worldwide for its nutritional benefits and versatility in cooking. Indeed, Tempeh is the primary source of protein for much of the Indonesian population. Maya has spin off from her strong background in Indonesian food and her longrunning efforts as a local advocate for Soybean sales from Decatur county to he home country of Indonesia to successfully use locally produced soybeans to product the SoyaMaya chips under her brand "Mayasari Tempeh," and they're available now in several grocery stores

and restaurants across Southern Indiana.

During her presentation (which included samples of the delicious snack) Mayasari discussed her desire to bolster not just appreciation for this traditional food but also the local agriculture economy. With a team of just six people (herself, her husband, Richard Mays, an administrative manager and three production managers), Maya has rapidly gone from concept to production and distribution of the SoyaMaya product, including building up a local production facility. Maya's stresses that her soy-based chips differ from other similar products on the market in

Medicare Agent/Rotarian Speaks to Upcoming Changes in Program Benefits/Costs

On October 21, Greensburg Rotarian Jaime Ritchey, a local Medicare Benefits representative spoke to Greensburg Rotarians about upcoming changes to Medicare benefits, programs, and supplementals.

Jamie identified the main drivers to upcoming changes to Medicare as the ongoing high inflation and associated 2024 Inflation Reduction Act, Reduction in insurance carrier payments by CMS, and a refocus by CMS on core medical/health benefits—moving away from benefits such as helping with grocery costs and utility payments.

Jaime stated that federal funding for CMS has seen cuts since 2023, and these cuts will continue into 2025. The federal government is in negotiations with pharmaceutical companies about cutting process for a number of name-brand drugs, but there is no clear indication of how this will affect the majority of Medicare recipients.

Medicare recipients can expect a slight increase in copays. The government is working with insurance companies on a deal to limit drug plan increases in 2025, but expect reductions in benefits and increased costs in 2026. It's likely that dental benefits will also be reduced or eliminated.

Jaime stressed a few "important things to consider: your ANOC from your insurance company will show upcoming changes in coverage; it's ESSENTIAL to have your Medicare plan reviewed during the open season for changes; ignore the barrage of advertising on TV, radio, email, etc. - these are most often not the best options; it's illegal for anyone to call you to solicit any aspect of your Medicare benefits; and never, ever give out your MBI number and/or zip code.

Greensburg Rotarians Rise and Shine in Early-Morning World Polio Day Event



World Polio Day was celebrated 24 October, and Greensburg Rotarians came out (very early) to pass on the message to Greensburg residents that the battle to eliminate this disease is "this close" to victory. Rotarians gathered as early as 5:30am at the local Cornerstone Bakery to hand out purple-iced donuts to customers of the long-standing, local shop. Purple icing was chosen in recognition of the purple dye used on the finger of Polio vaccine recipients to indicate they've been inoculated

World Polio Day is an annual observance when members of Rotary International, along with public health advocates and individuals com-

mitted to a polio-free world, convene to commemorate their accomplishments in the global campaign

against polio. This day also provides a platform for deliberation on the requisite measures to permanently eliminate polio from the face of the Earth.

October 24 was selected for this annual event because it's the birthdate of Virologist and researcher Jonas Salk, the man who led the first team to develop a vaccine against poliomyelitis. Use of this and subsequent vaccines has resulted in a 99% elimination of this fatal or crippling disease worldwide.



US President Biden Issues Official, Oct 24 Statement in Honor of World Polio Day



On October 24, 2024, United States President Joseph "Joe" Biden issued the following statement about World Polio Day:

The United States is proudly a leader and core strategic partner in the world's quest to eradicate polio and because of our efforts, the world has a historic window of opportunity to end polio for good. Today, we reaffirm our commitment to secure a polio-free future.

Through our leadership in the Global Polio Eradication Initiative, our sustained commitment to ending polio has resulted in 20 million people walking today who otherwise could have been paralyzed. We have reduced the number of children paralyzed by 99.9 percent and vaccinated over 3 billion children against polio. However, polio persists in some of the world's most challenging environments.

If high vaccination rates against polio are not achieved and maintained, including amidst instability, conflict, and misinformation mounting around the world, the risk of polio outbreaks will rise even in places long considered polio-free, like we've recently seen in New York, London, and Ukraine as well as in Gaza, where all parties must ensure the safe and effective implementation of the polio vaccination campaign that is urgently needed throughout Gaza.

In order to achieve the goal of eradicating polio, the world must rally together. Delivering a polio-free world with stronger health systems and communities is not only the right thing to do for humanity, but a smart investment in the health of future generations and our collective global health security. Together, we can make it a reality.
