## New District Governor Shares Vision for Rotary in Coming Year

District 6580's newest District Governor, Lance Eberle, sat down with the Greensburg Rotary Club's Board of Directors and also addressed the club membership at their Monday meeting during a visit on 17 July 22. Ederle, who now serves as leader of the district's 33 Rotary clubs and 20 Rotaract clubs, took the time to share some perspective on the way ahead for Rotary in the 2022-23 year.

Eberle began by celebrating a district that is emerging from pandemic restrictions. All clubs are now meeting in person, as is the Rotory Youth Leadership Ayunda (RYLA). The

tary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA). The district is also restarting its Rotary Youth Exchange efforts now that Rotary has opened for travel as of 01 July 22.

The District Governor said that this emergence from the pandemic's restrictions is a time to be bold and try new ideas. It's also, he believes, a time to bring to a final end the historic pandemic disease Polio. Eberle is encouraging all clubs to plan a public event in conjunction with World Polio Day (11 October 22) to raise public awareness of the disease and eradication efforts and to make the final push toward ending Polio forever.

Eberle also addressed the need to continue and increase support for the Rotary Foundation. He pointed out that district grants made possible by the foundation had resulted in significant contributions to the community in the past years, including providing library and art therapy for human trafficking survivors, providing on-level books for first graders, and providing students with safe access to social clubs. Increased Foundation funding would mean an increase in these types of grants.

"If the Foundation is the fuel, members are the engine," said Eberle as he went on to discuss membership challenges for Rotary. "Rotary does not have an attraction problem," he said, citing 160,000 new Rotarians in the past year compared to a loss of 170,000 members, "we have an engagement problem." Eberle believes that we need to more actively and empathetically engage with our newest Rotarians, identifying the challenges and perceptions that keep them from staying. "Engaging new members should be a core function," he said, stressing that clubs should imagine how to re-define the club experience from a potential or new member's perspective.

A native of Bloomington, Indiana, Eberle joined Rotary in 2002. He has served on his club's Board of Directors and member ship committee. He was Club President in 2013-
