

Chief Alan Hill, Oakwood Public Safety Director: Citizens Police Academy



When you have a medical or other safety emergency, minutes count. The only truly consolidated Public Safety Department in the state of Ohio, the officers of Public Safety can respond to any safety, medical or fire call with an average response time of two minutes and are all state-certified in law enforcement, firefighting and emergency medical services. In addition, the department works with the city and citizens at That Day in May, the Farmer's Market and special events such as Cram the Cruiser, Operation Santa Sleigh, Thanksgiving Meal Delivery and the FOP Annual Easter Egg Hunt, reimagined as a parade.

The department motto is "Service Before Self" and if you're interested in learning more about this unique department, their services and officers, the city has created the Citizens Police

Academy (CPA), a 10-week course held in the fall on Wednesday evenings. The comprehensive academy is limited to 12 students and emphasizes hands-on learning in areas such as traffic stops, welfare checks, usage of firearms and tasers, driving impaired with "drunk goggles," and evidence collection. Designed to promote a positive relationship between the citizens of Oakwood and the Public Safety Department, it is also the perfect opportunity to ask questions about the department and why what you think officers might encounter day-to-day on the job is probably very different from what they actually do encounter.
