HEY, OHIO HAS A SHORELINE TO PROTECT TOO, YOU KNOW!!!

The "Keeping Ohio Safe from Pirates and Michigan Residents" Edition

It was terror on the high seas: U. S. and Swedish seamen were subject to kidnapping by Tripoli pirates in exchange for monetary tribute until President Thomas Jefferson asked for Congressional authority to end the piracy. Congress passed "An act for the protection of commerce and seamen of the United States against the Tripolitan cruisers," establishing the USCG (originally the Revenue Marine Service) under Secretary of the Treasury Alexander Hamilton. The RMS later became the Revenue Cutter Service, and in 1915, was

combined with the U. S. Lifesaving Service to become the Coast Guard.

We were **GOOD** at this and pretty much killed it on our quiz (unfortunately, to the detriment of Tom's enthusiastic fundraising attempt)! Today was Coast Guard trivia day and questions included which is older; The Coast Guard or Navy (Coast Guard), the Coast Guard reports to Homeland Security (others to the Department of Defense), there are six branches of the U. S. military, the Coast Guard was created in 1790 at the request of President Jefferson for Congressional funding and it was overseen by Alexander Hamilton, and the city of New York has 40K police officers, the same number as service members in the Coast Guard. The Coast Guard was founded to protect U. S. seamen from pirates, the first station was founded in Cape May, New Jersey in 1926, and the Academy is located in New London. Finally, the Coast Guard's Ancient Albatross ceremony recognizes the passing of the title from one enlisted aviator to another to honor the enlisted aircrew member with the earliest graduation date from an aviation technical school; the aircrew member also receives the Royal Pterodactyl Egg.
