

Jeff Mogg, Chapter Co-President Sleep in Heavenly Peace



In Montgomery County alone, over 1,380 children need a bed of their own to sleep in. Nationally, **Sleep in Heavenly Peace** just passed the landmark of **200,000 beds** manufactured and delivered. Sleep is critical for children to develop emotionally, increase attentiveness and alertness, and to build auditory and visual awareness. Some sleep on the floor and often, there is no furniture of any kind in their home and no opportunity for the child to have safety, security and a small bit of ownership of even one small space. Sleep in Heavenly Peace started in 2012 with one small act of kindness: to build one bed for a single family at Christmas and then the wood left over was used to build another bunk and then another, and since then, SHP has grown to a national organization dedicated to build and deliver handmade beds and bunk beds to families in need, all using volunteers and donations.



All beds are built from scratch (no kits!), made to last a lifetime, and are delivered "ready to sleep†with a mattress, bedding and a pillow and volunteers with the Dayton Sewing Collaborative Partnership sew fun, colorful comforters to top them off! At their "Build Days,†SHP provides training (no experience needed), power/hand tools, and the opportunity to network and provide critical support to the community.
