



President Moorhead announced the sad news of the passing of T.R.'s father, a man who spent his life dedicated to fraternity and community.

December 9, 1927 â€" July 12, 2024



TR Routsong's father, known as "Mr. R,†recently passed after a life dedicated to service, learning, kindness, and empathy. His passion for engineering and airplanes led him to start his career at Wright-Pat where he developed many aircraft, and he designed his own home, "The Tree House.†He was a member of the Masonic Fraternity and was a founding member of the Kettering-Oakwood Exchange and Lions Club of Oakwood. A true gentleman, he led by example because he was a servant leader; all who know Mr. R were better people because of him.

After today's meeting there will be a **tree dedication ceremony for Larry Leese** at **Judy Cook Park** at the corner of Oakwood Avenue and Schenck Avenue. Larry's family will be there and there will be opportunities to share memories of Larry during the dedication.

CHECK PRESENTATION

Joe Schenk presented Rotary Foundation president Cathy Campbell with a check for \$25,000, the largest check our treasurer will write in his tenure. TDIM is not only our gift to the community and a Rotary Day of Obligation, it's our largest fundraiser for the year and the Board is pleased to be able to donate a portion of the proceeds to the Foundation. The donation will continue our grant funding to local non-profits and charities.

The Foundation is tasked with oversight of our grant applications, including vetting applicants, voting on awards and investing our donations in an interest-bearing account. All applications require a club sponsor, the applicant must be a valid 501c3, and to be successful, the grant money should be used for something tangible and not for general operating budgets. We ask that applicants come to the Foundation meeting to present their request. We currently have \$47,319 in the Foundation's account and would like to spread the money around but do consider larger requests, our largest to date being the \$10,000 awarded to 4 Paws for Abilities.



Rachel Bane, Founder and CEO, Sunshine Books



For a child growing up in trauma and stress, finding the book *Ramona Quimby, Age 8* by Beverly Cleary was a lifeline. Just like her, Ramona is curious, excited, afraid and brave, all at the same time. Rachel didn't just find Ramona then, she found her life-long passion for reading and connecting children in need with their own *forever book*.



When a school board member told her their greatest need was books, Rachel started to work to bring books to meet children where they were. Some schools don't have libraries, children don't have books in their own homes, and they often don't have a way to get to a library on their own. Every child has a story, and finding their story in a book begins their literacy and socialization journey, increasing their chances of staying in school and finding employment. Rachel first built community connections through face painting, but transitioned after the pandemic to providing books, but her big challenge was how? Partnering with other local non-profits such as Brigid's Path and Shoes for the Shoeless, she brought tubs of books to them to read to children and let them pick out their own to-keep book. Recently partnered with Agape for Youth after losing their previous space, Sunshine Book Club will now have their own space to provide books, Acts of Kindness bookmarks and a spark of hope, reading skills, and inspiration to young learners.

Sunshine Book Club accepts cash donations, new or gently used books and is always looking
