

When there's not a shared spoken language, art is the path leading to communication and understanding. The founders of Be the Voice of Girls, Fatma Dodurka and Rotarian Carl Holtman, who lived in Turkey for almost 20 years,

created the program to provide a learning environment blending the English language with expression through art. Built on the three pillars of Arts, U.S. Culture and Spoken English, the curriculum is designed to weave learning about U.S. culture through storytelling, food, and journalism to encourage exploration and confidence-building.

Unfortunately, the program lost Fatma and her daughter Alara in the devastating 2023 earthquake in Turkey, but their mission continues through Carl and Rotary Club support. Clubs can sponsor or host events or provide volunteer support.
