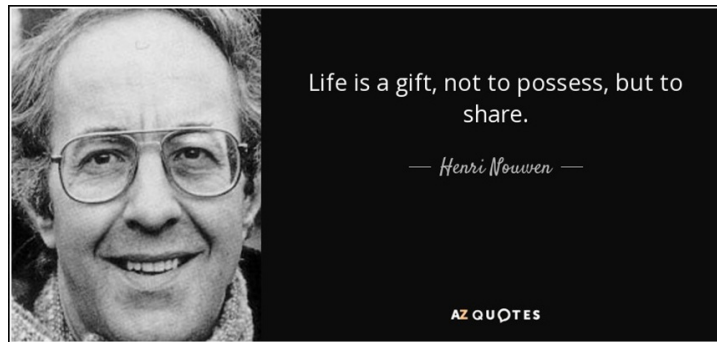

**Jim Zahora , Dayton Region Manufacturing Association**  
**The Voice and Advocate for the Manufacturing Industry in the Dayton Region**

Formed in 1934 and with a current membership of 200 local manufacturing companies and 130 supply members, the DRMA brings together businesses, students and the adult workforce to catalyze innovation, invention, improvement and education to drive the vitality of manufacturing in the Dayton area. Known as the "Invention Capitol of the United States in the early 1900s, Dayton is still regarded as a manufacturing powerhouse and remains on the cutting edge of developing sophisticated processes along with the highly educated workforce needed to execute advancements.

DRMA goes to the schools to connect with students through events, conducts over 30 tours a year of plants and hosts a Manufacturing Day in October to highlight automation, robotics and other innovations including 3D printing to create overnight prototypes that would have traditionally taken days or weeks. For adults, the focus is on their WorkAdvance program to recruit, train and place adults and the program is proud of their 100% retention rate of employment for the adult students who have completed the program. Their advocacy program strengthens the position of the region's manufacturers through government relations and their training and education program advisory committees.



Industry 4.0 will see increased development of robotics, automation, additive manufacturing, virtual reality and artificial intelligence through the process of making things, seeing how they are put together, and seeing how to they work to continuously encourage manufacturers to "take the leap" and resist the

temptation to get comfortable with tradition unimpeded by change.
