

PRESENTER Shaun Yu, WDPR public radio Discover Classical Music 88.1

What will popular music look or sound like in 50 years? That's unknown, but we know right now what classical music will sound like; timeless and eternal, Beethoven will be Beethoven and listeners will feel the same emotions hearing it, regardless of their generation. As recently as 1985, Dayton did not have its own classical music station and the process to provide fine arts programming in Dayton was established in November of that year when WDPR-FM 89.5 signed on to broadcast with seven-hour a day programming, staffed entirely by volunteers.

The fully listener and donation funded 88.1 station now provides non-interrupted, commercial and news free classical music from their library of over 11,000 music CDs, hosted by knowledgeable broadcasters who









In addition, the group holds the Young Talent Search Contest, a blind audition process and one of their recent winners performed at Kennedy Center in Washington! They also partnered with Grismer Tire for the "lt's Instrumental†used instrument donation program and over 150 instruments were recently donated. Discover Classical also provides a radio reading service where volunteers read newspapers, magazines and books via closed-circuit radio; the stations currently have over 35,000

listeners per week and with a newly acquired transmitter at Wittenberg, can now provide coverage as far out as Springfield.
