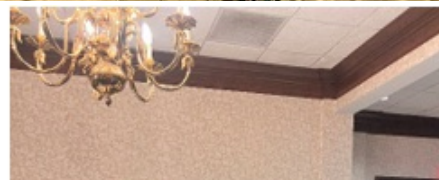

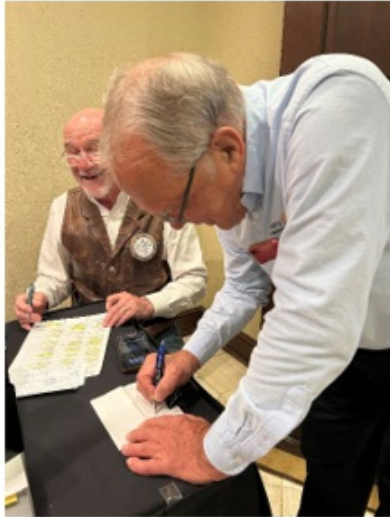

Speaker

Brady Kress, Carillon Historical Park

A visit to the Carillon Historical Park will have you saying “I had no idea that was from Dayton!” A city of firsts, this is where the first professional football game was played at Triangle Park, the first car to win the Indianapolis 500 was made, MacGregor golf, one of the most prestigious brands in the world, was founded in Dayton, American Trap Shooting was held here for decades, and the first Soapbox Derby was held in Dayton. At one point, Dayton was the largest purveyor of specialty soaps and if you stayed in a hotel, the chances the soap in your room was manufactured in Dayton.



Carillon Historical Park owes its existence to the generosity of Colonel Edward Andrew Deeds (1874–1960) and Edith Walton Deeds (1869–1947). In the 1930s, while traveling in Bruges, Belgium, Edith, an accomplished musician, found inspiration in magnificent carillon music, and she dreamed of sharing this music with the people of Dayton. Edith’s dream became reality through the construction of Deeds Carillon—her most visible legacy to the community she loved.

A renowned engineer, inventor, and industrialist, Colonel Deeds was a close friend and colleague of fellow Dayton luminaries Charles Kettering, John H. Patterson, and Orville Wright. Colonel Deeds co-founded Dayton Engineering Laboratories Company (DELCO), the Dayton-Wright Airplane Company, and the Engineers Club of Dayton, and served as the third CEO of National Cash Register (NCR).



The latest addition to the Park is the Carillon Park Railroad, custom-built in England from the original built in Cincinnati, the cars hold 120 passengers and is a to-scale model of the first passenger train to pull into Dayton. An impressive addition to the Park is the new Eichelberger Pavilion, a two-story grand ballroom overlooking the grounds (and also the site for our Christmas Party in December!).



Where do we go from here? The Neil’s Heritage House building has been recently purchased and will house the over 3,000,000 2D, textile and 3D archived items that are part of the Park’s collections and will be digitized and organized for more easily accessed information for historians. Future projects also include the Performance Pavilion that will provide a permanent stage for summer camps, performances and

square dances.
