Just one step, one phone call after college to Howard Kellman of the Indianapolis Indians asking "How do I get started in the business†led to a broadcasting career in the minor leagues that has lasted for over 36 years. Tom has been the voice of the Dragons on radio and TV for 16 years and has the distinction of working in Low-A, High-A, Double-A and Triple-A.

In his career, he has had the honor of working with many players who have gone on to have successful careers in the Majors and some have been elected to the Hall of Fame, including Randy Johnson, Larry Walker and Jim Thome. He has also worked with notable players from the Majors who have played for the Dragons during

injury rehab such as

BrandonPhillips, Aroldis Chapman, and Joey Votto.

The Dragons are the Red's High-A farm team along with the Single-A Dayton Tortugas, the Double-A Chattanooga Lookouts and the Triple-A Louisville Bats and the Dayton team has set numerous attendance records, including ranking third in attendance among all MILB teams, the largest draw in Single-A for 18 straight seasons,

first in Single-A for all 24 years of their existence, and the longest consecutive sell-out streak of 1,517 games. The games are known for their emphasis on quality baseball and family entertainment; every seven minutes, they have 90 seconds of time and fill

them with skits, singalongs, and contests.
