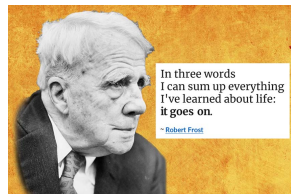

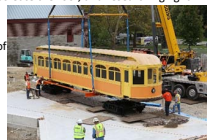
**Rick Schieltz, Restoration at Carillon Park**

If you want to eat in a Dayton & Western 1902 Interurban railcar (and who doesn't??), the experience is no farther away than Carillon Park and Culp's Café. The car, number 602, was purchased in the 1960's and turned into a private residence in an area near Troy. The car was added on to, windows were covered, holes were dug in the floors, the wheels and support mechanisms were removed, and the car gradually fell into disrepair and was silently rotting away.



The car was donated to Carillon Park where the Restoration Team eagerly undertook the project of restoring it while maintaining fidelity to its original look and feel. They started by taking off everything that didn't belong, assessing what could be retained, tearing out rotten wood, opening covered-over windows, adding new glass, curving plywood to recreate the roof, and researching light fixtures to match the existing lights.

Even the four layers of paint were researched to match the original color of the paint, and Rick, a stained-glass maker, created an image of the Carillon Tower to place in the round window on the side of the car.



After the restoration was complete (it was housed and worked on at a RTA storagesite), the car was driven by a self-propelled, remotely operated flatbed to the Carillon, where it was lifted off the flatbed by a crane and settled in at its home in Culp's Café, where patrons can take their food into the car and dine at one of the tables inside. The Café is open Tuesday-Saturday from 10:00 AM-2:00 PM and parking is free!!
