An integral part of the efforts to retain military personnel in Ohio after separation, the Dayton Development Coalition supports the creation of quality jobs, capital investment, pitches the region to new companies, and supports defense installation projects. Positioning Dayton as the center of the Third Revolution of Flight and building on the established intelligence and research and development in the area, they are proud of having a hand in positioning Dayton and Montgomery County as the best in the region at creating jobs. Responsible for the investment of over \$7.45 billion dollars in capital investment, in 2023 alone the DCC partnered with JobsOhio to create 39 projects, 5,212 jobs committed to the area, and over \$1 billion in investments.



Their commitment is to rally around one goal: to grow the local economy through diversification in a variety of areas including advanced manufacturing, automobile development, food sciences, healthcare, information services, and logistics and their DCC Fly-In is one of the United States' most extensive and enduring community-wide programs. This initiative, launched in 1984 by the Dayton Area Chamber of Commerce, continues annually with the primary objective of bridging the gap between local interests and federal governance in Washington, D.C. Each year, local leaders visit Washington, D.C. to engage with federal officials, advocate for regional interests, promote economic development, and improve quality of life. The highlight is a Capitol Hill reception, offering networking with lawmakers and business leaders interested in Ohio.
