

FOUNDATION GRANT AWARD to HARMAN ELEMENTARY PTO

The Rotary Club of Oakwood and Oakwood Rotary Foundation President Cathy Campbell (Club sponsor Victoria E. Hix) presented **Harman Elementary Principal Sarah Patterson** and third grade parents and students with a grant award of \$820 to install a large-scale permanent map of Oakwood at the school. The third-grade students study local and community history while building map skills and the map will help them track where they've been; they'll be able to create photo frames for the spots they visit. Cathy also announced that the Foundation wrote their last check for the fiscal year on Tuesday. The **grant award total for the year is \$58,283** and the positive influence on services and the community is far greater in its reach than just the dollars awarded. TDIM is the major fundraiser to support the Foundation's grants so please spread the word to friends and the community that the event is not just a celebration, a portion of the proceeds directly benefits area social services. The Foundation's first year of giving was started with \$12,000 and each year, they've been able to increase that amount and overall, they have awarded over \$800,000 since their start.


Larkin Vonalt, Executive Director, Dayton Book Fair

Did you know that the "Most Extraordinary 2nd-Hand Book Fair in the Country is in Dayton, Ohio? As their website states, the Dayton Book Fair, with its brick-and-mortar Rabbit Hole Books bookstore located at 29 West First Street, has an elaborate mission: They provide a meaningful place for people to donate their beloved books, they sell donated books to benefit three local non-profits each year via the third-largest used book sale in the United States, hold curated online sales, and also sell books and more at the Rabbit Hole Books store. They are proud to announce that beginning in 2026, they will bestow a new award for literature, the Curious Medal for Literary Endeavor to recognize authors and in 2028, plan to provide writers' residencies. In 2025, a portion of the Dayton Book Fair proceeds will go to Family Promise of Greene County, the Gem City Roller Derby, and the Ohio Performing Arts Institute, along with other projects and in return, they only ask for 60 hours of volunteer work back.



To "turn books into dreams," the Dayton Book Fair offers over 300,000 items in over 75 categories, most priced at \$1-\$2 including vinyl, CDs, ephemera, DVDs, jigsaw puzzles, a tag sale, and special books in Wonderland, all clean, curated and organized. They have shopping carts, free packing service and drive-up loading for large volume purchases all day Friday. This year, the sale will be held from Friday November 7 to Sunday November at the Montgomery County Fairgrounds, 645 Infirmary Road. Friday hours are 9:00 AM-7:00 PM with a \$10 wristband available online in advance and at the door. Saturday and Sunday hours are 9:00 AM-5:00 PM, admission is free, Sunday is \$10 Bag Day and there are special Sunday hours for teachers and literacy-based nonprofits. All forms of payment (no bitcoin) are accepted.
