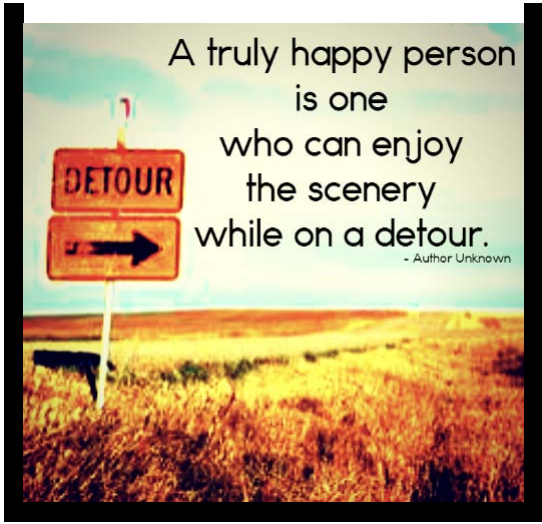

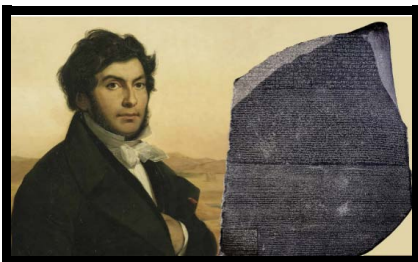

Katie Harper, Consumer Scams, Ohio Attorney General's Consumer Protection Section

Sometimes, you just have to end the call or delete the text. Be rude and just end it. Getting someone to answer the phone, keeping them talking, and taking advantage of someone's wanting to be polite is how scammers try to steal your money and identity and with social media and texting, it's just getting worse.

Classic scams to be on the lookout for include the Unusual Payment request for gift cards or a Venmo or Zelle money transfer and despite what they tell you, the sheriff's office does not take Amazon gift cards in payment and your grandchild does not need a gift card to get his or her car towed off the side of the highway and get to safety.

Another tactic? The Pressing Request that must be handled immediately or within 24 hours or your Social Security or other benefits will be suspended. Doesn't happen, never will, and a government agency will never initiate contact by phone. If he or she is too good to be true and can never meet

you but is deeply committed to you (and your bank account), then it's a Romance Scam. Business Impersonators will try to get you to click that link, respond to that text or call that phone

number and unless you were expecting a contact, check it out and go into your account directly or call to confirm that it's for real. Check Cashing from Stolen Mail is for real and try to take your mail directly to the post office if at all possible instead of putting it in a mailbox. And if someone asks to remote into your computer for about 30 minutes to fix out-of-date virus software, it's a Computer-Repair Scam they're poking around in your files for bank account numbers and personal information while you wait. Setting up an MFA (multi-factor authentication) password or way to be notified and approve a request for access to your accounts can help keep your information or money safe.
