PROGRAM:

Steve Carrell provided the history and current status of the Pearl House of which he was the project manager before he retired from Muskingum Behavioral Health. About 8 to 10 years ago, leaders began looking at a Recovery Residence on a grade scale for Zanesville. Steve and others were involved in the development of Lancaster, Ohio's recovery residence, and they were able to learn from that process. After a few challenges in Zanesville, the Pearl House opened this past fall. It is an \$8 million facility.

Steve introduced the group to Shanda,

an apartment resident, who shared with us her personal story about recovery and her experience with her daughter. She was happy to welcome her daughter to her apartment this month.



Steve shared that it was important for the Pearl House to be a safe space with affordable housing. There



are 34 units with 1, 2, or 3 bedrooms. The rent is based on a renter's income, and is very low cost for most. With this opportunity, they hope for the residents to gain education and employment advance, increase in income, and increase in long-term recovery.

Several churches have adopted the Pearl House by providing various services. After the meeting, many Rotarians offered
