### HISTORY "FACT OF THE DAY"

With temperatures expected to drop drastically in the coming week, Grant shared how pre-historic and ancient peoples kept warm. The discovery of Otzi, a man from the Copper Age (3500-2300 BCE) who was found mummified in a glacier, has shed some light on the matter. Otzi was discovered in 1991 on the side of a valley in the Alps in Italy. His mummy dates back over 5300 years ago. At the time of his death, he was wearing a coat made of sheep/goat hide with fur on the outside, cape made from grass, leggings, loin cloth, and belt made of sheep/goat hide, shoes made from deer hide with a grass lining, and a bearskin cap.
