Justin Denius is currently in his first year as the Director of Workforce Development and Career Pathways Coordinator at the Muskingum Valley Educational Service Center. Justin is proud to lead the Muskingum Valley Business Advisory Council which was recently recognized by the Ohio Department of Education as a three-star business advisory council. Justin has also been recognized by Future Forward Ohio for the creation and implementation of the Muskingum Ohio Valley Educational Service Center Driving School. This driving school is effectively eliminating the first barrier to workforce development in our region, a valid driver's license.

Prior to coming to MVEESC, Justin was

the principal at Shenandoah High School in Noble County. While at Noble, Justin and his team were able to attain STEM designation from the Ohio Stem Learning Network thus

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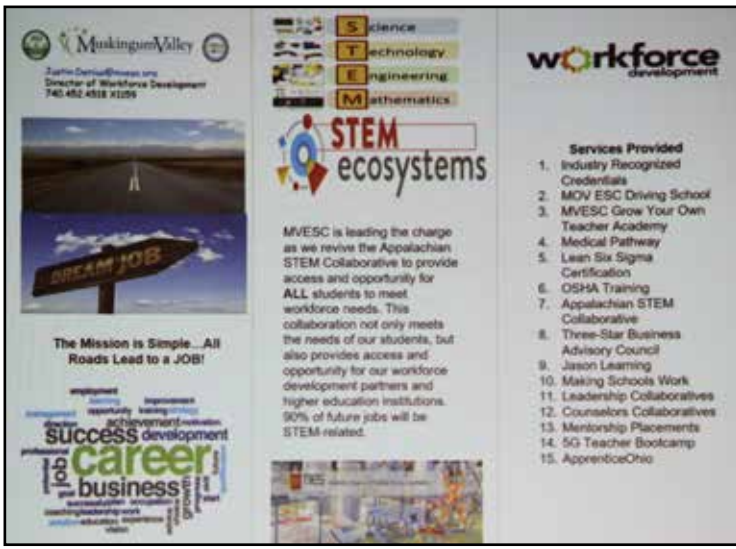

Another accomplishment while at Noble included Shenandoah High School being named a branch campus of Zane State College. With over 100 semester hours of college credit offered at Shenandoah HS, students were provided hope, access, and opportuni-



ties second to none in the state. Justin is passionate about bringing these opportunities to the region as we continue to transform the HS experience, thus preparing our kids...not just for something...but for anything!

Focus on STEM: Science, Technology, Engineering and Math; Also means Strategies that Engage the Mind.

Here is a list of Justin's and MVESC's areas of focus:

1. Workforce – 12 point graduation pathways with Industry Recognized Credentials like OSHA 10 hour, CPR, Lean 6 Sigma and Rise Up
2. Driving School – OVESC and MVESC worked to put together a grant to put driving school back in high schools. They have 30 teachers and 440 students in the pipeline from Riverview down to the Ohio River.
3. Teacher Academy – Borrowed the idea from Gulfport, MS. MVESC is working with Zane State to offer basic college level teaching courses in high schools to build a cadre of teachers. His son went to Otterbein with 37 credits of Zane State courses that fed directly into Otterbein's teaching program
4. Medical Pathway – (he started this at Shenandoah), work with Zane State to deliver the Multi-Skilled Health program during a student's junior and senior year of high school. They partner with area hospitals to place students for practicums.
5. Working with The Safety Group to deliver OSHA 10 cards to students.
6. Appalachian STEM COLLABORATIVE – OVESC, ECOESC and MVESC collaborative with the goal of developing an ecosystem to support the creation of STEM culture in schools in order to better prepare students for the in-demand jobs of the 21st century and beyond.
7. Jason Learning – all schools in MVESC has a Jason Learning membership for a year to sample and upskill their lesson plans
8. 3-star Business Advisory Council
9. Multiple Leadership and School Counselor collaboratives
10. High School Mentorship programs

11. 5G Bootcamp through Ashland University at New Lexington High School to train teachers in CyberTech

12. Apprenticeship Ohio – If you would like to offer apprenticeships, please reach out to him.

13. You Science: Kids play brain games to find out their aptitudes. Then they are matched to possible careers.
