### PROGRAM

President Elect Dylan Parry announced the guest, Gary Sultan.

**BIO:** Gary's passion is building relationships between Nurses, Physicians and members of the C-Suites. This passion has extended to *Every Rotarian is a Peace Builder*. "Building relationships," says the former cardiac surgeon, "that's the focus of my lens. I want to build relationships between health care providers so they can talk to each other, and understand each other in a way that improves patient care and relationships."

Gary combines his personal experience of transformational transitioning with a wide range of training and has synthesized a coherent philosophy that helps him install processes that teach people how to intentionally build relationships, how to ensure that there is an infrastructure of trust and safety in a team that supports its shared vision.

This is a process Gary knows well, because he's been through that journey himself. After a three-year fellowship in cardiac surgery at the Cleveland Clinic Foundation, Gary entered private practice in Columbus, Ohio. Among his achievements there was starting the cardiovascular surgery program from scratch at Doctors Hospital in Columbus. But after 25 years as a heart surgeon, Gary had to re-evaluate his life and work as he overcame his own medical challenges. Two neck surgeries and open heart

surgery cost him his identity and his immortality in a span of 12 months, and meant he had to rediscover his life’s purpose and meaning.

Gary’s training includes becoming a Certified Executive/Life Coach at the Hudson Institute in Santa Barbara, CA; clinical and organizational system development at the Gestalt Institute of Cleveland (GIC); focused training in group work in Israel GIC and Cleveland; and the Leadership Development through Emotional Intelligence program at Case Western Reserve University’s Weatherhead School of Management. He also has had extensive training at the Arbinger Institute in both Choice in Coaching and Choice in Coaching Leaders programs as well as training in facilitating the World-Class Leadership program “The Outward Mindset”.

He is now taking this same process to *Peace Building in Rotary*. He is a member of the Westerville Sunrise Rotary Club and Chairs the Peace Building Committee. As we know there is the business of Medicine and the Art of Medicine. The Art is treating patients like human beings with their challenges, objectives, fears, cares, needs, hopes, and dreams. Also, helping them with the journey of wellness. Well, there is the Business of Peace Building and there is the Art of Peace Building. Through Arbinger’s “The Outward Mindset Program”, we can focus on others rather than focusing on ourselves. Only when I truly see others can I support them to be successful with their objectives and their

challenges, Seeing others is the first step toward Peace Building in Rotary.

Gary lives in Ohio with his wife Connie and two Golden Retrievers.

Gary gave an inspiring presentation on Peace Building, highlighting much of what is covered

in the Master Class with Outward Mindset. He showed two videos to support his point. The



first video covered Outward Thinking, or focusing on seeing other people, and observing those who make us feel seen. He challenged us to be the person who sees others.

The second video focused on Inward Thinking and how this type of thinking causes the individual to classify people into “vehicles,” “obstacles” or “irrelevant.” He challenged us to self-examine and try to recognize when we are doing this. We can do this by asking these questions: Why is fundamental change so hard? What problems do you want to solve? Why is it so difficult to enact change? What’s getting in the way?

If we want to create peace, we have to take the time to get to know the other person and understand their fears. We need to see others, adjust our efforts and then measure the outcome. We measure the outcome with our 4 Way Test: Is the truth, is it fair to all concerned, will it build good will and better friendships, and is it beneficial to all concerned?

To close, President Corey shared a quote from Ghandi
