Stacey expanded our understanding of the writing style for Dr. Seuss. She explained that Dr. Seuss wrote in a poetic meter called anapestic tetrameter, which has 4 metrical feet per line. Each foot has 2 unstressed syllables followed by a stressed syllable.

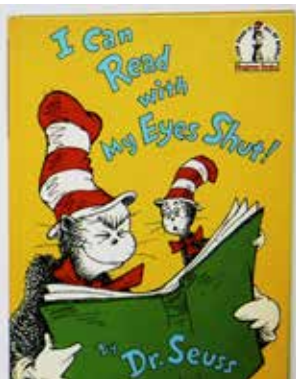
