ANCIENT HISTORY

One of my irrational fears used to be getting in a plane crash or other disaster and losing my contact lenses or glasses. In 2021, I got Lasik eye surgery, which put that fear to rest.

Did you know that the history of eyewear has ancient origins?

Archeologists have uncovered lenses in Assyria dating from 3,000-2,000 BC which were made from crystals, gems, and glass and were likely used as tools to start fires.

Around 250 BC, Ptolemy of Egypt developed a rudimentary theory of light refraction and correctly identified the refractive index of water.

Around 70 AD, Seneca from Rome discovered that a water filled globe could be used to magnify objects, including books and writings.

Arguably, the father of optics was an Egyptian named Ibn Al-Haytham who wrote a seven-volume Book of Optics around 1021 AD. Around this time, the Vikings were using lenses made from quartz crystal - probably to start fires.

Around 1268 AD, an English monk named Roger Bacon invented the first modern magnifying glass.

It is thought the first pair of spectacles were invented by an Italian monk around 1280 AD, which was then copied and publicized by a Friar named Allesandro della Spina.

Around 1330 AD, the first pair of glass spectacles were invented in Venice.

It makes you wonder how people with poor vision got by back in ancient and medieval days, where there were no contact lenses, glasses, or eye surgery, or electrical lighting.
