PROGRAM:

The 4-Way Test

Ruthie Ware reported that many Interact Clubs members competed in the virtual contest. Participants had three rules to follow: 1. The presen-



tation must be no longer than 5-7 minutes; 2. There must be a practical application of the 4-Way Test; 3. The presentation must be given in a clear voice.

Judges listened to all participants last week, choosing the final two students for today's presentation.

The first contestant, Madison Winland, spoke on hardships related to Autism Spectrum Syndrome. She then explained how each step of the 4-Way Test might be applied to help defuse the stigma related to the syndrome.



The second contestant, Alyssa Northrup, connected ways in which the 4-Way Test could help eliminate stereotypes, bias, and racial profiling.

Ruthie then announced the contest winner: Madison Winland, a student at Zanesville High School.

Madison is looking forward to her next steps to becoming an Intervention Specialist.

Runner-up Alyssa Northrup, a student at Maysville High School, is planning to seek the necessary education to become a pediatrician.

Chad Tyson was the collector today. Donations are dedicated to eradicate polio and are matched 2 to 1 by the Bill Gates Foundation.

Melissa Best reported the virtual dedication of a rehabilitated house on April 23rd, and that Habitat for Humanity's ReStore is in need of donations, especially furniture.
