Daybreak Rotary - April 8, 2021

CALL TO ORDER:

President Corey Hamilton called the meeting to order at 7:15 a.m. Rotarians joined in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

- Misty reported that the virtual dedication of the latest home will take place at 3:00 p.m. on April 23rd.

- Janet Stewart thanked her committee members for help in setting up the Student Musicians

Program for next week and reminded members that there will be a special code to join the program.

- Corey announced that the target date for our real-life meeting is set for April 22nd, reminding members that meal reservations will be needed. She also noted that the seating arrangements will be new at the Country Club.

SERGEANT-AT-ARMS:

Tony reported on the success of the City Vehicle Auction. There were 189 vehicles up for auction, with only 20 left at the end. Brad Lynch suggested donating the \$630 profit from the concession stand to the Fine Fund. All agreed.

PROGRAM:

Since Brent Mirgon had received no formal background information from today's speaker, he introduced Becky Clawson, Director of the Carr Center, in his own very creative way.



Becky opened with some very good news - Safety Town will be back in June and July for students who missed it last year and those of age this year. In addition to Rotary's help with funding, Creative Packaging is a new partner this year - fabricating new "houses" for Safety Town.

Becky told the story of Dylan, age 3, with a speech delay problem. He has seen a 46% improvement in his first year and will be Kindergarten ready when he leaves the program this summer. There are 46 children in the program currently. Although the Speech Therapy/Toddler Enrichment Program is in a classroom setting, each child spends one-on-one time with

a Speech & Language Therapist.

An Intervention Therapist on staff is working with 28 students after school and on Fridays to supplement their math and literacy skills. There is also a mental health component to teach coping skills and stress relief activities.

The Adult Daycare Program averages 12 participants each day. In addition to fun activities such as cardio drumming, crafts and live music, participants enjoy taking part in service projects such as labeling books for Rotary.

The Carr Center is fortunate in having SEAT as an active partner in providing needed transportation.

The virtual Cake Auction is scheduled for Wednesday and Thursday, April 28th and 29th. Drop off for the cakes is Tuesday, April 27th from 8:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. at Secret Auditorium.

President Corey thanked Becky and promised a cell phone sanitizer kit as a token of our appreciation.

Unless people understand and learn about our world, habitats, and animals they won't understand that if we don't protect those habitats, we'll eventually destroy ourselves."
