ANCIENT HISTORY "FACT OF THE DAY"

Did you know that there are numerous references to eclipses by ancient peoples?

- Spiral-shaped carvings in a megalithic stone monument in Ireland constructed around 3340 BCE, which predates the famous Stonehenge, appear to depict an eclipse. This lines up with a total eclipse calculated to have occurred around that same time.

- Bone inscriptions from ancient China describe an eclipse: "The sun has been eaten." The Chinese believed eclipses occurred when a celestial dragon devoured the sun.

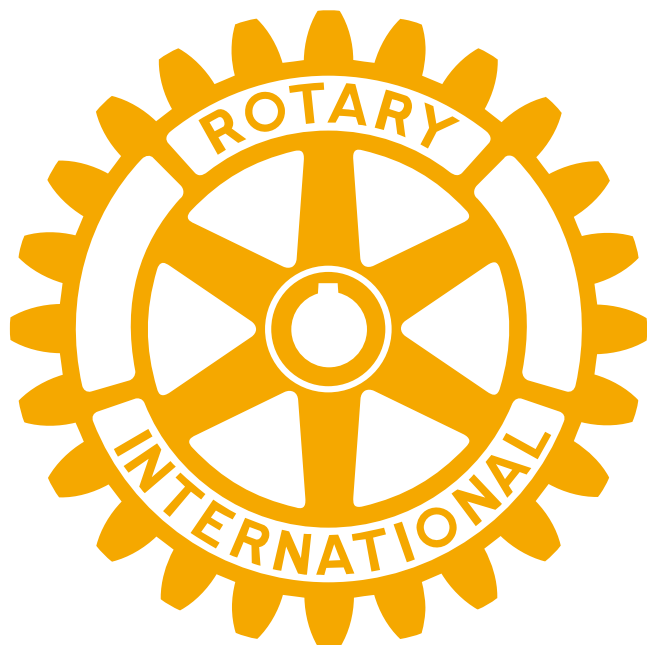
- Clay tablets from ancient Babylon reference various eclipses, too. One Babylonian record talks about "day turning into night."

- The Ancient Assyrians noted a famous eclipse known as the Bur-Sagale eclipse on cuneiform tablets, believed by some to have occurred in 763 BCE over the city of Ninevah.

- In the Book of Amos in the Old Testament of the Bible from around 750 BCE, it reads, "On that day I will make the Sun set at noon and in broad daylight, the Earth will be dark."

- The ancient Greek poet Archilochus wrote about an eclipse: "There is nothing beyond hope, nothing that can be sworn impossible, nothing wonderful, since Zeus, father of the Olympians, made night from mid-day, hiding the light of the shining Sun, and sore fear came upon men."
