As a reminder, the intent of this award is to recognize a Rotarian who has exemplified Rotary’s motto, “Service Above Self” through recent Club involvement.

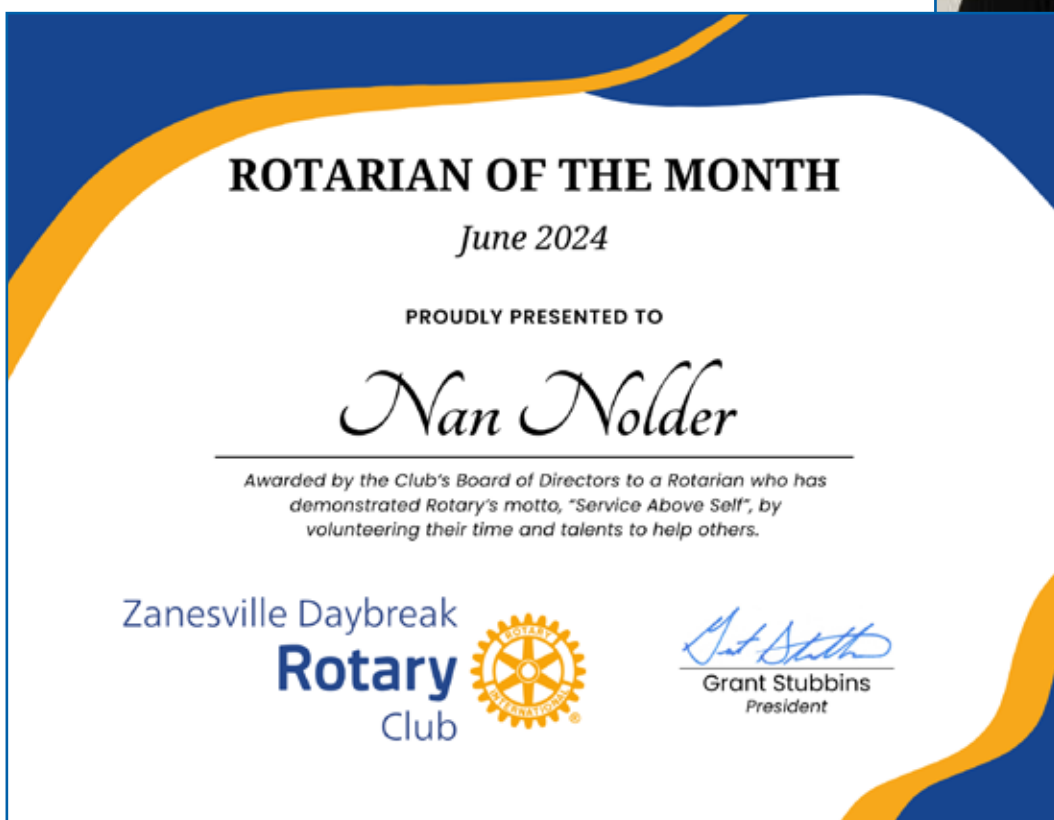
The winner will be featured in our Club newsletter and receive free breakfast for four weeks.

PROGRAM –

Francine Swiger to introduce program Betsy Rosser and Abriana Newsom - Muskingum Soil & Water Conservation District.



Betsy is the Urban Agriculture/Education Specialist for the Muskingum Soil & Water Conservation District (MSWCD). Betsy talked about the Urban Greens Program, whose mission statement is "Growing Food, Growing Community, Growing with Purpose."



In 2023, the Urban Greens Program grew 18,102 pounds of food which was donated to local food pantries, hot food services, organizations, and school lunch programs. This effort involved 150+ volunteers and 940 volunteer hours spent in area gardens.



Some of the area gardens that the Urban Greens Program supports include: Marshall Greens Garden, Brighton Grows Garden, Restoration Park Garden, Zanesville Community High School Garden, and High Hill Presbyte-



rian Church Garden.

Although MSWCD is a quasi-governmental entity, the Urban Greens Program is supported largely through grants. For example, in 2023, the Program received major grants from the J.W. & M.H. Straker Charitable Foundation.

Abriana also spoke. She is the AmeriCorps VISTA Member for the MSWCD. She assists with a lot of the grant writing for the Program. AmeriCorps VISTA is a national service program designed to alleviate poverty, and participants serve full-time 1-year for a non-profit organization or governmental entity.

ANCIENT HISTORY “FACT OF THE DAY”

May 27th was Memorial Day, which honors U.S. military personnel who died while serving during battle or otherwise. You may be interested to know that the concept of memorializing soldiers who died during battle dates back many centuries.

The academic journal *Antiquity* suggests that the 72-foot high burial mound known as the White Monument in Tal Banat, Syria (formerly part of Mesopotamian) is the world’s oldest known war memorial, dating between 2,450-2,300 B.C.

This determination is based on excavation evidence showing that the White Monument contains the



systematic placement of bodies of what appear to be soldiers between the ages of 8-20, alongside slingshot pellets and animal skins.

Until this discovery, archeologists were aware of many Mesopotamian inscriptions documenting the burial of enemy corpses after battle in a mound, which was a symbol of punishment and victory (reaching towards heaven), but there has been no physical evidence of that.
