### PROGRAM:

Francine Swiger introduced our speaker, Kathleen Bullock, from Owens Corning. Kathleen is a native of Zanesville and received her Bachelor of Arts Degree from Capital University, majoring in Biology with a minor in Chemistry.



Currently, She is an Advanced Scientist with Owens Corning Fiberglas at their Science and Technology Center in Granville, Ohio.



Kathleen has worked primarily in the chemical binding process of fiberglass insulation. She has also worked on other programs such as chemically modified asphalt for waterproofing foundations, and spray foam sealant



used as an air infiltration barrier. Through her efforts, she continues to travel throughout the United States, Canada, Finland, Poland, and Sweden testing chemical binders in the manufacturing facilities.

Kathleen shared information on the development and evolution of fiberglass and was able to pass around samples of different types of fiberglass insulation.



## ANCIENT HISTORY "Fact Of The Day"

Today's fact was about everyone's absolute favorite topic - lawyers.

According to the Vanderbilt Journal of Entertainment & Technology Law, evidence of the first written laws were found on stone tablets from ancient Sumeria dating back to 2113 B.C.

The elite ruling class of ancient Athens Greece commissioned politician and lawmaker, Draco, to assemble one of the first codes (or compilations) of law in 620 B.C.

Later, the Athenians elected philosopher Solon to reform their codes of law, which laid the groundwork for the development of the legal profession.

Solon's reforms required an individual to represent himself in legal disputes, but over time, the system evolved to allow an individual's friend to speak on his behalf.

As the legal system developed in ancient Greece, so did the need for eloquence and persuasion.

Professional orators from ancient Greece were the predecessors to modern day lawyers; however, a law was passed in 403 B.C. that prohibited these orators from charging a fee (the law was largely ignored).

Most historians agree that the legal profession itself was established in ancient Rome. Roman Emperor Claudius, who ruled from 41-54 A.D., officially recognized the profession and permitted advocates to charge a fee for their services.

So, next time you have to pay a lawyer, you can blame Emperor Claudius.
