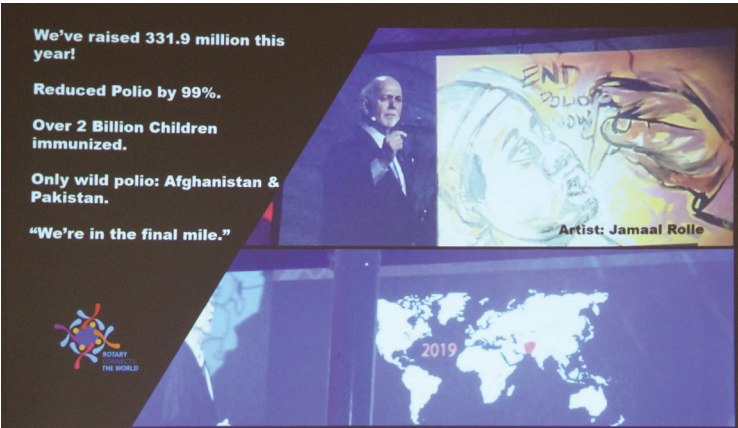


juice, coffee, and tea. These changes are necessary to help continue the good work of our Club and balance the budget.
