### PROGRAM

Jack Russett introduced world renown crossword puzzle designer Judge Vic Fleming who has designed over 1,000 puzzles and spoken to Rotary Clubs in 11 different states.



He was born in Jackson, Mississippi, and grew up in Greenville, Mississippi. He holds a B.A. in English from Davidson College and a J.D. from the

University of Arkansas at Little Rock School of Law. He has taught at Bowen as an adjunct faculty member since 2003. He was elected as a district judge for the City of Little Rock in 1996, and reelected in for 5 terms without opposition.

Judge Fleming has written two books of legal humor, including Real Lawyers Do Change Their Briefs; edited five other books, including three volumes of crossword puzzles; and published a collection of crossword puzzles entitled I Swear.



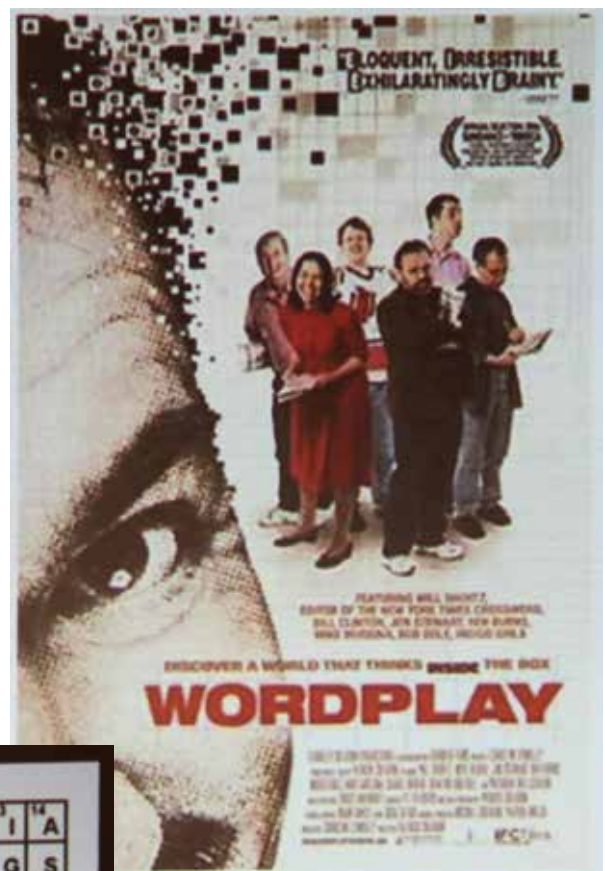
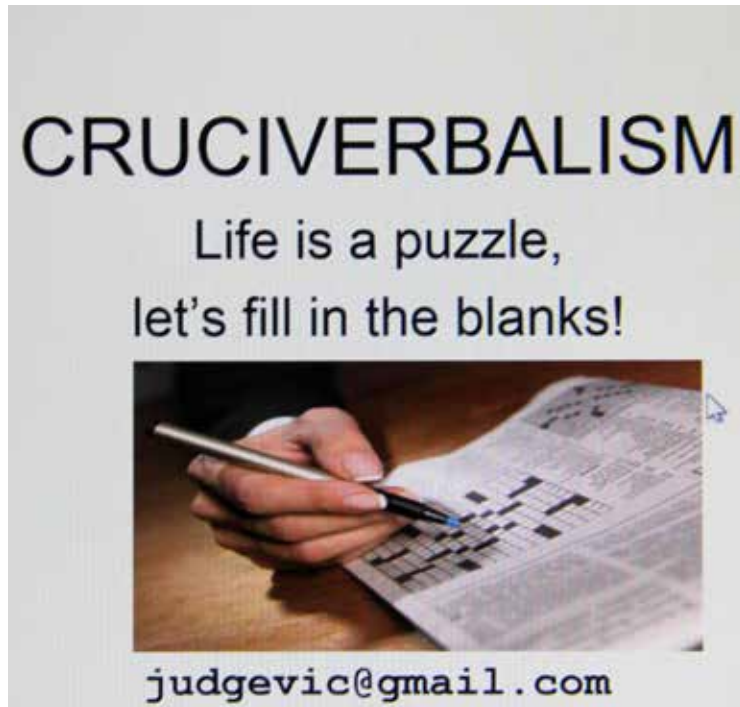
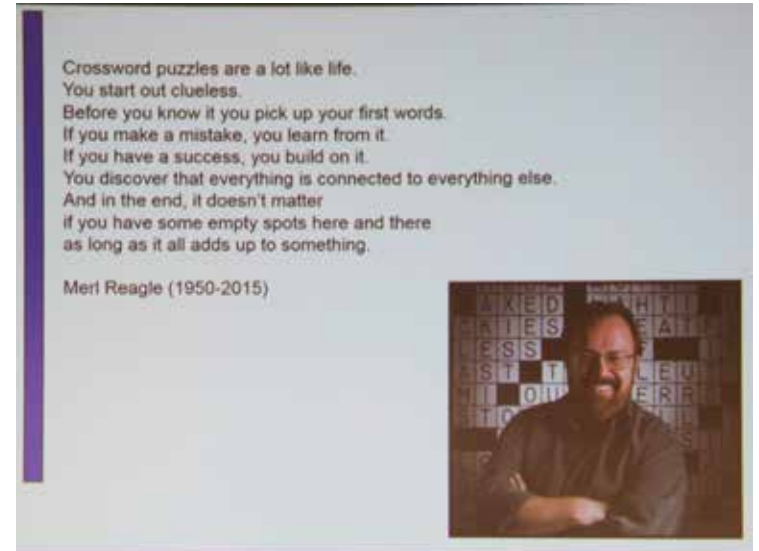
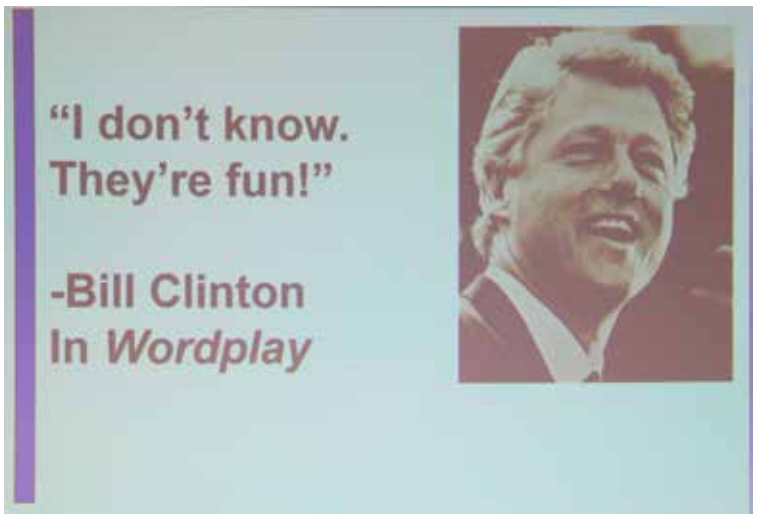
His crossword puzzles have appeared in the New York Times and many other newspapers; several magazines, including Games Magazine, The Rotarian, and The American Lawyer; and several books, including the Simon & Schuster Mega Crossword series and Random House Casual Crosswords; and in other venues. He appeared in the 2006 documentary Wordplay, which also featured a song that he wrote. The New York Times crossword puzzle published

on Friday, May 12, 2017, was collaboratively constructed by Fleming and former president Bill Clinton who is also a huge fan of crossword puzzles. When Clinton was asked why he like crossword puzzles he quoted as saying: "I don't know...because they're fun".

Each puzzle takes about 4 to 5 hours to design. There are basically four steps to puzzle design:

- 1) Establish a theme
- 2) Form the grid
- 3) Add in the words
- 4) Write the clues
