PROGRAM –

Brian Wagner introduced Beth Fox of the Muskingum County Community Foundation (MCCF) to share the "Make Muskingum Home" Program. Beth indicated that Brian Wagner and Susan Holdren, of the Straker Foundation, attended a conference in 2015 during which she learned about a city's program that sought to encourage young professionals who had completed a postsecondary credential to come back to their hometown. They were determined to make this happen in Muskingum County, but ran into some issues such as giving money to student loan companies legally. They overcame those issues and the program began last year for individuals who live and work in Muskingum County. Beth had the pleasure of joining the "Surprise Squad" which came to the chosen individual's place of employment to share with that individual that they were going to receive up to \$50,000 over 5 years. Thirteen individuals were selected by a committee that reviewed application information



and a short video of each candidate.

One of our own Rotarians, Carter Brown, was fortunate to have been selected this year.

Beth shared that they are always accepting donations and they ask for us to share the infor-



mation with individuals we know who could be eligible. The second round of applications will open on September 1.
