HAPPY BUCKET/POLIO PLUS

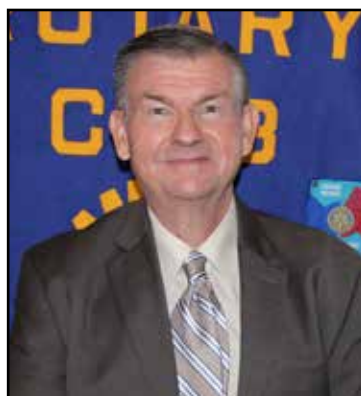
A.J. Patel passed the happy bucket.

Dana Matz introduced our guest speaker Dr. Richard Hall, superintendent for Mid-East Career and Tech-

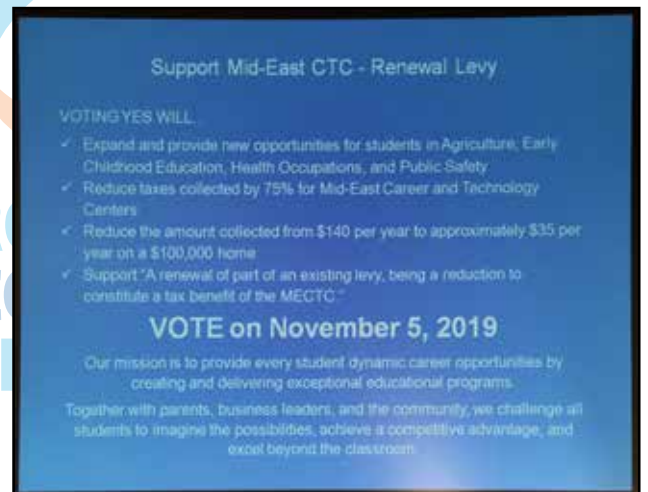


nology Centers. Dr. Hall is a graduate of Ohio University. He is married to Linda and they have a son named Grant. His high school was

Their commitment is the success of every student. Their strategic plan is to form partnerships throughout the district, to place the right student in the right program. They strive to recruit the right students, to retain those students and



to place those students on a good career path. The Mid-East Career Center's long term goal is student achievement.

Mid-East serves 13 schools throughout this region. They have campuses in Buffalo and Zanesville. The Buffalo Campus has 11 different programs and the Zanesville Campus has 22 programs. They also offer an Adult Education programs in electricity, nursing, heavy equip-

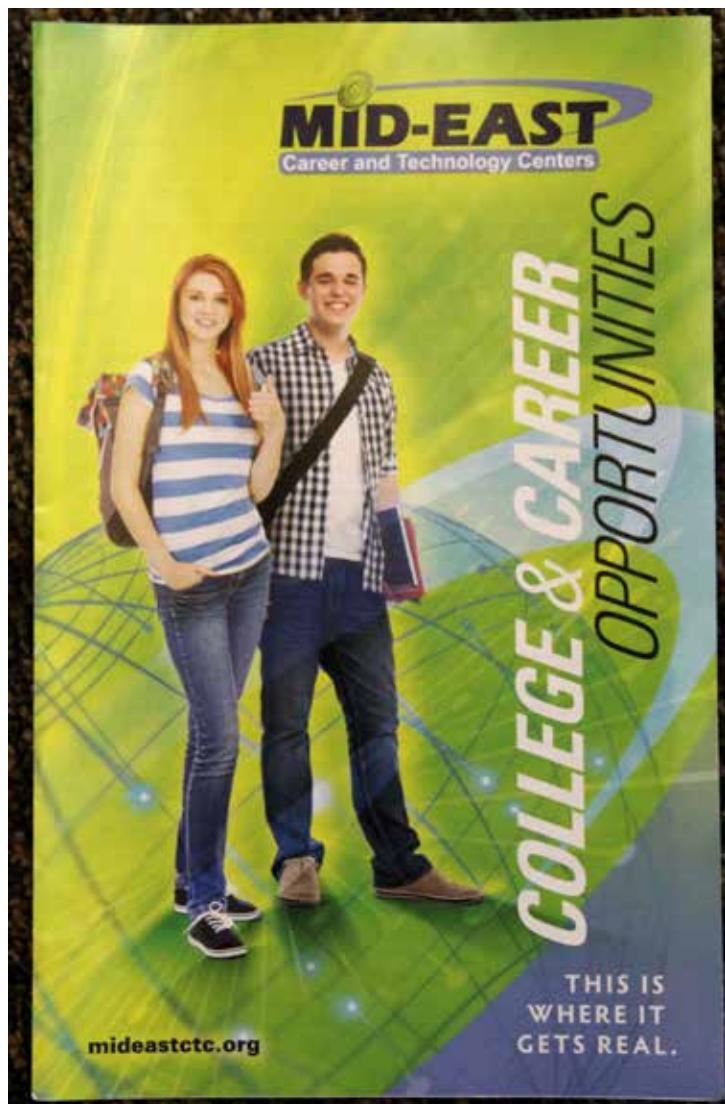
ment operator, paramedic, power lineman and welding to name a few.
