PROGRAM:

Art in our Community – Zanesville Concert Association - Jim McLaughlin

Brian Wagner introduced Mr. McLaughlin: Jim retired after a successful 31 year career teaching vocal music students in the Zanesville City Schools. His choirs have achieved superior ratings at Ohio Music Education Adjudicated events and Disney World competitions. He has served the Ohio Music Education Association as District 9 president, accompanist and chairperson for honors choir festivals, and serves as a music judge for Ohio music adjudicated events. He was music director of the Zanesville Civic Chorus for 27 years. In 1999, he led the choir to a New York performance of Handel's "Messiah" in Carnegie Hall. He was assistant director of the Y-City Barbershop Chorus for 22 years and has played in the Zanesville Memorial Concert Band for over 50 years. Jim presently holds leadership positions with the Thursday Music Club and is the booking agent for the Zanesville Concert Association. He has a music teaching studio giving piano, organ and voice lessons. He serves on several music scholarship boards. He is Director of Music at Central Trinity United Methodist Church.

Awards: American Red Cross Hometown Education Hero, NAACP "Foot Soldier in the Sand", MLK Scholarship Fund "Realizing the Dream", Phi Delta Kappa Outstanding Educator, Stewart-Glapat Academic Scholar Award, and Who's Who in America.

Mr. McLaughlin started by reminding us that we should not just talk about STEM – we should talk about STEAM. By studying



music and the arts, we stimulate the creative side of the brain, which builds math skills and encourages innovation. More than 100 years ago in the Zanesville area, a group of women felt that music was missing from the local culture. They came together to found the Thursday Music Club to promote music and the arts in our community. Eighty-three years ago, the Zanesville Concert Association was founded. In the early years, they performed in the Weller Theater. Now they host performances in Secret Music Hall.

Over the years, they have hosted such names as The Canadian Brass, Neil Sedaka, The Oakridge Boys, The Association, Vince Gill, and Tony Bennet's band.

They are able to get big names because of Zanesville's location on Route 70. Artists pass East to West, or West to East while touring, and may want to simplify a show or try out new material with a smaller crowd.



The ZCA has faced hard times in the past: It had significant issues in the 60's, but they survived. The Pandemic was also hard on them. But they are returning to business with a vengeance. They have an impressive line-up for this year!

Tickets are \$55 for one concert or \$65 for a season pass. Children can attend concerts for free. College students can also attend for free with a college ID.

Mr. McLaughlin hopes that we can all attend at least one concert this fall!
