PROGRAM –

Peace Day Activities

MJ started out by giving the club a brief history of International Day of Peace (World Peace Day) which was created by the United Nations. Peace has been part of Rotary's DNA since its inception in 1905. Daybreak



Rotary has focused on Peace Projects since 2015. We have distributed 5400 Andy and Elmer Books, and we erected the Westview



Park Gazebo and Peace Pole. We decorated Peace rocks which will go around the pole. MJ talked about how her Yoga training teaches ahimsa – which is the idea that if we do not ground ourselves in non-violence, everything else in our lives will be precarious. MJ introduced 3 speakers from 3 different faiths with 3 messages of peace.

1. Chris Steele gave a message from the Christian faith. He spoke of the Apostle Paul's

greeting "Go with grace and peace." He talked about the importance of giving grace to those with whom you disagree, and how by doing so, you will give yourself peace.



2. AJ Patel with a message from the Hindu faith. He shared a beautiful prayer song from the Hindu religion.



3. April Gibson gave a message from the Jewish faith. She spoke of the importance of accepting all people, regardless of faith, because we are all part of the human race.



MJ wrapped the presentations by saying that World Peace Day does three things: it reminds us that

we are all connected to each other; it reminds us to believe in something bigger than ourselves; and it demonstrates that small actions can make big impacts.

ANCIENT HISTORY "FACT OF THE DAY" -

Grant shared his history fact: To "Pax Romana" is latin for the "Roman peace," considered to be an approximately 200-year Golden-age of Roman peace, order, and prosperity beginning around 30 B.C. with Octavian's (Augustus) defeat of Mark Antony and Cleopatra at the Battle of Actium. The term is a bit of a misnomer, because the Romans viewed peace not as an absence of war or conquest, but rather as an absence of meaningful resistance.

Interestingly, the Romans had a structure that represented Rome's status with respect to peace and war, known as the "Temple of Janus." The Temple was located near the Roman Forum and named after the two-faced God of "beginnings, gates, transitions, time, duality, doorways, passages, frames, and endings." The Temple was constructed by the second king of Rome, Numa Pompilius, who succeeded Romulus. The Gates of Janus, (the Temple's doors), were closed when Rome was at peace and opened in times of war. Unfortunately, the doors were almost always open. Since the time of Numa, the Gates were said to have been closed only in 235 B.C., after the first Punic war; in 30 B.C., after the battle of Actium; and several times during the reign of Augustus.

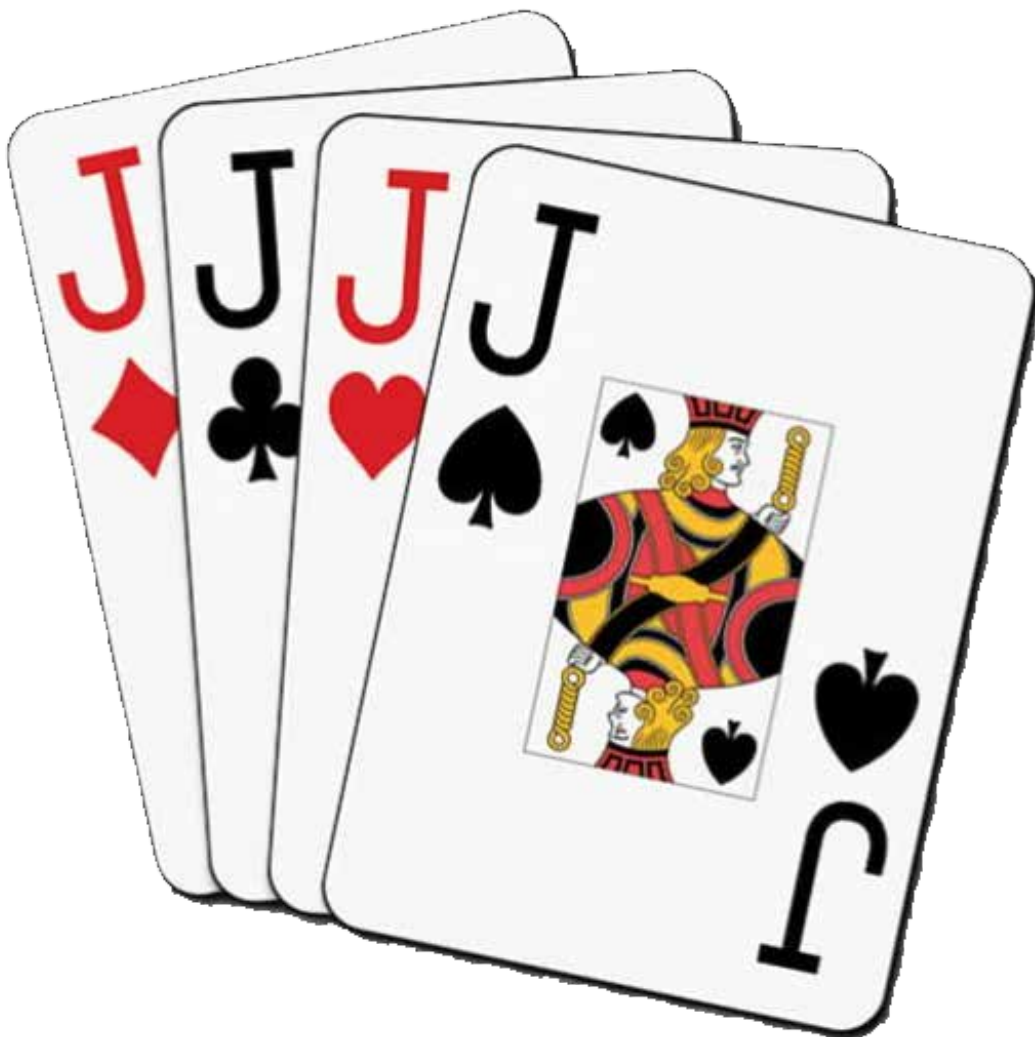
