Gary Phipps was the guest speaker. He is with the Lifewise Academic Character-Building group. He shared that they work with several schools in which students and their parents have signed up

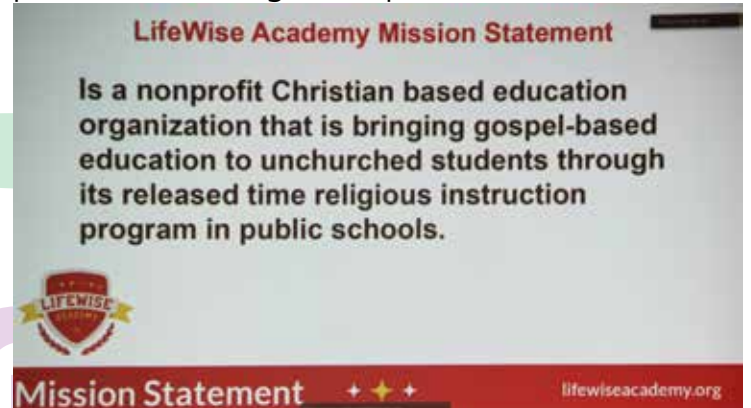

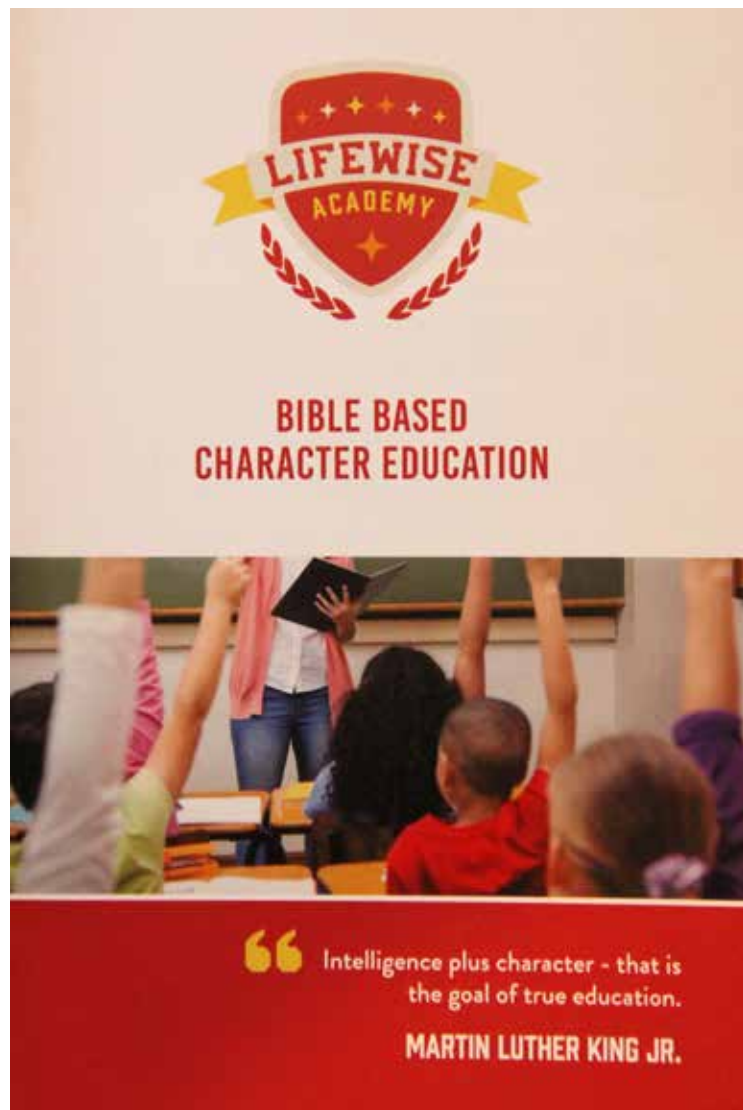
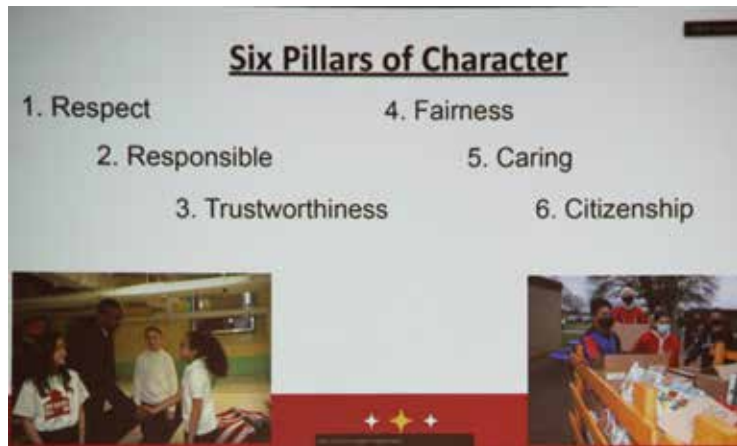
- The Maysville Interact students described their annual holiday greenery fundraiser which benefits high school students who are in need.
