PROGRAM:

Chris introducded Jeff Berry, Muskingum County Game Warden for the Ohio Department of Natural Resources. Jeff shared that he recalls seeing the growth on Maple Avenue, as he was born on a street





off of Maple. As the growth occurred, we displaced the wildlife that previously enjoyed the woods and farmlands. He talked about the wildlife that he often gets calls about such as bobcats, deer,

and other animals who often get close to residents' homes. He encourages us to try to enjoy the wild-life. He reminded us that there is no hunting within city limits; he often has to deal with poachers or hunters with-



out licenses. His main area is Muskingum County but he does have jurisdiction to make arrests anywhere in Ohio. Some of his work in the winter time is doing surveys of various animals to get a count to determine hunting limitations for the upcoming hunting seasons. He also has seen a growth in the eagle population within Ohio.
