PROGRAM

Dana Matz introduced our guest speaker, Sean Fennell from the Muskingum County Library System. Sean is the Marketing and Community Relations Director. With a very accomplished educational background in a number of different locations throughout the U.S.A., Sean comes to the Muskingum County Library System from the Licking County Library System. One of the first things Sean wanted to know was how many people had library cards? He also expressed that library cards are free, that is right, they cost you \$0.00.



Their mission statement is designed around their ability to open doors for curious minds and to foster the love of reading which broadens one's horizons. Reading helps to encourage exploration and discovery of new ideas.



Muskingum County Library's strategic plan is: advance all literacy, world class customer service, reimagine service, create an Outreach Department, and enhance financial solvency. The library system has six locations throughout Muskingum County to assure easy access where ever you are located.

The need for the library system can be expressed by the large number of participants in the programs they offer. They had over 33,000 people participate in their training programs last year. They had 680,279 materials circulated, and over 2,500 kids participate in the Summer Reading Program. They offer OverDrive and Hoopla to download e-books and digital materials. They offer tech help for digital devices. You can go to their website and find all of the information needed to contact them for tech support.

Sean also informed us, that they had a 199 seat auditorium in the basement that was available to rent and in some cases could be rent free for charitable organizations.

They have more than books you can check out. You can check out binoculars, WI-FI hot spots, and even a ukulele. Their primary focus does remain books and literacy. The library was forced to put on a new roof and incorporated solar panels into the project. They also have a place on their website where you

can see the environmental impact of the solar panels.


The library is currently putting in three charging stations for electric vehicles. They should be up and running in the near future.
