Dear Rotary,

Hello there! My name is Reuben Tang, a senior currently majoring in Architectural Science and Chinese at Western Kentucky University (WKU). I am an American-born Chinese born in Chinatown, Manhattan, and later moved to Glasgow, KY, where I attended K-12, and later to Bowling Green, KY for college. I am currently in my Capstone Year of WKU's Chinese Flagship Program. The capstone program provides an articulated overseas capstone experience to support the goal of creating global professionals. For my first capstone semester, I am directly enrolled in National Yang-Ming University, learning alongside other flagship students in direct enrollment classes related to our academic interests. During the second semester, I would complete an internship in Taipei arranged by The Language Flagship customized to meet my individual professional goals. In a nutshell, I have one more year before I graduate from WKU.

Concurrently, I am planning on applying for the 2021 Rotary Global Grant in December. 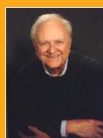
