

In 2020, the Rotary

Foundation created a new vehicle to help Districts respond to natural and humanitarian disasters - the Disaster Relief Grant. Our District has received two of these \$25,000 grants - the first to help non-profit organizations reduce the spread of COVID-9, and the second to respond to the December 2021 tornados in Western Kentucky.

Rotary has set up a special fund to help Ukraine and its neighboring countries help refugees and respond to war devastation. In solidarity, our District Foundation Committee decided to contribute \$25,000 of our District Designated Funds to Ukrainian relief. Our Partnering for Peace initiative, led by Rotarian Fred Cowan, is endeavoring to connect our clubs directly with Rotary Clubs and Districts in the affected areas. Stay tuned for new developments!

Tornado Recovery Status

Thursday, June 30, 2022



has been almost six months since devastating tornados ripped through Western Kentucky and Rotary District 6710. The outpouring of support from Rotarians, clubs, and districts across the US and around the world has been overwhelming. Over \$659,000 in donations have been received to help impacted families, businesses, and communities recover and rebuild their lives.

The District has responded to this tragedy by establishing two Disaster Relief Grant programs... The first involves allocating funds from a \$25,000 grant from The Rotary Foundation. These grants started by helping families reconnect their electricity to the grid. The program has since been expanded into helping families repair and reconstruct their homes and lives in the community.

The second grant program has empowered Rotary Clubs in District 6710 to fund recovery and rebuilding projects up to \$10,000 per project. 29 of these projects have been recognized or approved to date, allocating over \$273,000 to those in need.

As recovery efforts proceed, all the clubs in District 6710 are encouraged to discern the needs in their communities and respond to those needs by submitting a grant application.
