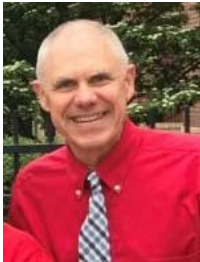

The death toll is now at 37, with hundreds still missing. Larry and Rebecca Roy are spearheading an effort to provide donations to those who have been affected. This region is in desperate need of resources and help.

Our members at Hunting Creek have always been generous with a giving heart. **For those who are looking to participate in providing relief, we will have a box truck in the HCCC parking lot on Tuesday, August 9th. We will collect donations at the truck from 8 am to 7 pm on Tuesday, August 9, 2022.** If you would like to drop off items prior to Tuesday, you can bring to the Clubhouse. The truck will depart for Letcher County (Whitesburg) early Wednesday, August 10, 2022. The donated items will be delivered to various churches and missions serving the people.
