GLOBAL GRANT APPLICATION SUBMITTED

The University of Kentucky College of Engineering has been collaborating with Makerere University School of Food Technology, Nutrition, and Bio-engineering to develop a process that converts waste plastic into fuel. A pilot project was undertaken in 2015 at the University in Kampala, Uganda and completed using a wood-fired rocket stove. This Global Grant project will be used to purchase, assemble, and distribute 15 stoves for implementation in Kampala and neighboring districts. Beyond Uganda is an NGO operating in Uganda that will assist in the placement of stoves and the training of the stove operation. The main objective of the project is to use each of the stoves to establish a small business for the owner/operator and encourage the development of a circular economy in
