Tripp described some of the restaurant's features which will include visibility of the meat preparation and cooking areas. The current Venue North wedding reception area will be maintained with a separate kitchen and expansion to include corporate events and possibly a music venue. The restaurant and venue are expected to create 60 jobs in Lawrenceburg.
